

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE TO APPLY To Elite EMT Academy's EMT-B Program?

• You are 18 years of age or older

- o If you are 17 years of age, but your 18th birthday lands before the last day of class for the course you want to enroll **YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY**.
- There is no age limit/maximum age, although students must be of sound mind and able to adequately perform the cognitive psychomotor skills necessary to pass the class.
 - Physical exams ARE NOT required.
 - Medical Insurance coverage is preferred but NOT required.

• You have completed a minimum education of:

- o GED (General Education Diploma)
- High School Equivalency Certificate
- o High School Diploma

• You have a clean criminal background

- You DO NOT have any Felony convictions.
- You DO NOT have any convictions containing assault, kidnap, sexual offense or higher charges of possession/distribution of a controlled substance.
- You DO NOT have any pending court dates filed against you or pending court dispositions.
 - **Marriage and custody **DO NOT APPLY**.
- You DO NOT have any recent charges/arrests within the past year.
 - This includes: Felony, Class A Misdemeanor & Class B Misdemeanor
 - Class C Misdemeanors and minor traffic citations ARE acceptable.
- o You **ARE NOT** currently on probation.
- A POSITIVE CRIMINAL HISTORY will be accepted (outside of pending court dates and/or pending court dispositions) if you present a letter of EMS Certification Eligibility from the Texas Department of State Health Services EMS Division. This letter is required to be dated within 6 months of the class start date but will not be accepted after the class starts. The letter must clearly determine and state that you are eligible for EMS certification in the State of Texas. This letter will override any prior conviction(s) (Felony, Class A or Class B Misdemeanor) if you are deemed eligible. If you have a positive criminal history and are still not sure if you are eligible, please complete an EMS Criminal History Pre-Screening with the State of Texas before applying to the EMT-B Program. This criminal history pre-screening can take up to 6 months to result.
