Homecoming minutes

October 19, 2024

Meeting started at 12:20PM

The meeting started with an Adytum On High for recently deceased alumni brothers Marlin Evans, Phil Farace and Reed Miller. Jeff Bruno started by reminiscing on Marlins contributions to the continuance of the Beta Psi Chapter during our rebuilding from 2007 to our re-chartering in 2012. Comments by other alumni brothers Ron Steckel, B ill Horvath, Jeff Miller, and Eric Koch on their memories of Marlin were added. Jeff Miller then read the Sigma Pi Adytum On High in remembrance of these deceased alumni.

Presidents report: Jeff Bruno

Working with the current group of actives has been inspirational. They are the best group of actives he has worked with. They are always present at work parties (15 – 20 actives present at each work party). There is a work part on the 3rd Saturday of each month. We need alumni mentors with tools and expertise to lead these inspired actives. The actives are very involved in campus activities and won all Greek events this past year. They hustled to get the house filled with brothers when the University imposed housing restrictions on the student body at the eleventh hour, requiring all students to live on campus for their first two years. This greatly impacted our housing of younger brothers who had already made the commitment to live at 12 Smith Street.

Treasurers report: Jeff Bruno

Covid made things very difficult for us to fill the house because of the restrictions placed upon us by the AUTHORITIES. Due to these restrictions we did not have full house occupancy and the fraternity was not allowed to grow or replace graduating brothers. Cash flow was extremely limited while bills continue to rise. We only had 7 brothers living in the house which generated \$23,000 in rental income. We continue to recover from that shortage.

We have had some crazy high expenses this year that could not be avoided, or were necessary to generate more rental revenue.

Property tax	\$ 18000
Mortgage (700/month)	\$ 8400

We now have 11 brothers living in the house which will generate \$34000 in rent. We still need more money for utilities, flooring, a kitchen remodel, repairs to the badly sagging front porch, staircase repairs and numerous everyday upkeep expenses.

Our budget to run the house this year is \$62000. There is \$10000 remaining on the mortgage. **We need** alumni donations to make up the shortfall or the house will continue to decline!

The Grand Chapter Award is the result of the communication lines he made with National and changes he implemented in the running of the fraternity and a renewed sense of self respect among the chapter actives. Hendrix will continue to guide the chapter as our New **Chapter Advisor** with national.

Vice presidents- Outgoing VP Eli? and new VP Jordan? Thanked the alumni for coming today and for their support in the past. We encourage Alumni presence to build relationships between the actives and Alumni. Alumni should feel welcome to visit and interact with the actives. As VP he is in charge of establishing committees for various projects and keeping them on track. He has a membership committee with a table on campus weekly to promote fraternity awareness.
