...people did not know where his kingdom was...

...in order to recount their beliefs and to fix them to memory, they gave them their own names to all things and the nature of their beliefs changed in many ways as different nations were established and languages branched out..."

Writing and re-writing history, science, etc., to try and make sense of or find god, and/or who we are and where we came from - again a story for another time - but just for the record Snorri lived from 1179 - 1241 ad.
