Save the date: **Fall Tea Party**, Saturday, October 15th. The Ladies Guild is accepting donations of new items to be used for raffle prizes at the upcoming Fall Tea Party. Gift cards & monetary donations are also welcome.

Update on the Ukraine Relief Donations. Between March/July St Johns collected \$33,530.40 for Ukraine relief. By now, \$24,680.00 was sent to the Eparchy of Mukachevo (through the Eparchy of Passaic) for assistance of the refugees, while \$5,425.00 was sent to the organization "Volunteers of Transcarpathia" mainly for the purchase of the medical supply. Such a disproportion in distribution is due to the fact that St Catherine of Siena Rom Catholic parish sent St Johns \$22,936.40 to be destined to the Eparchy of Mukachevo. The remainder of donations (\$33,530.40 minus \$22,936.40) was divided in two halves: one for the "Volunteers of Transcarpathia" and another for Eparchy of Mukachevo. The Volunteers of Transcarpathia sent us a thank you note that can be found in the vestibule.
