Clarity of Purpose

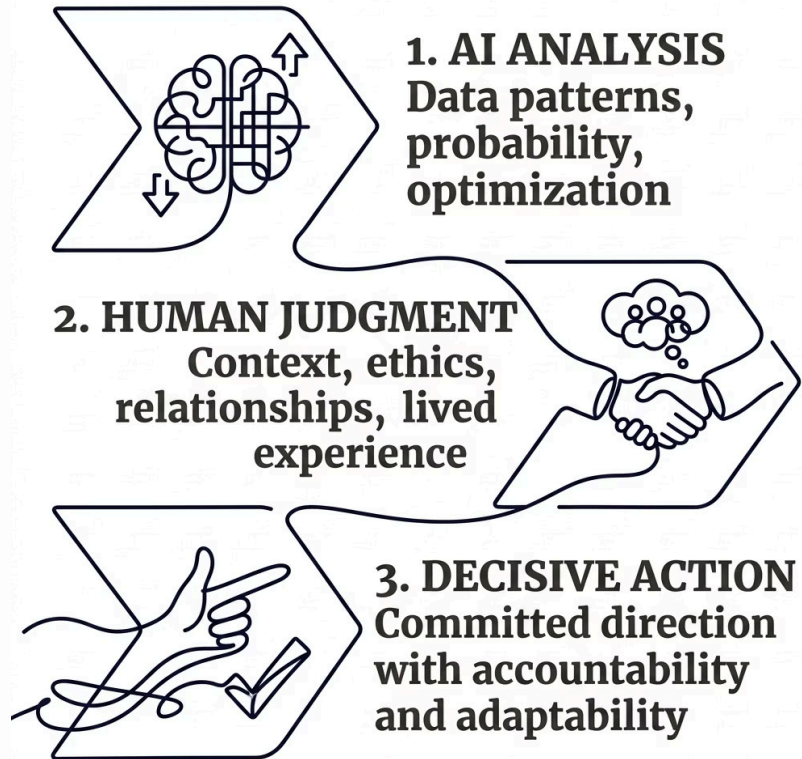
Galup reports only 41% of employees know what their company stands for. Leaders who articulate purpose reduce turnover by up to 50%.

Accountability for a decision is a uniquely human act of courage.

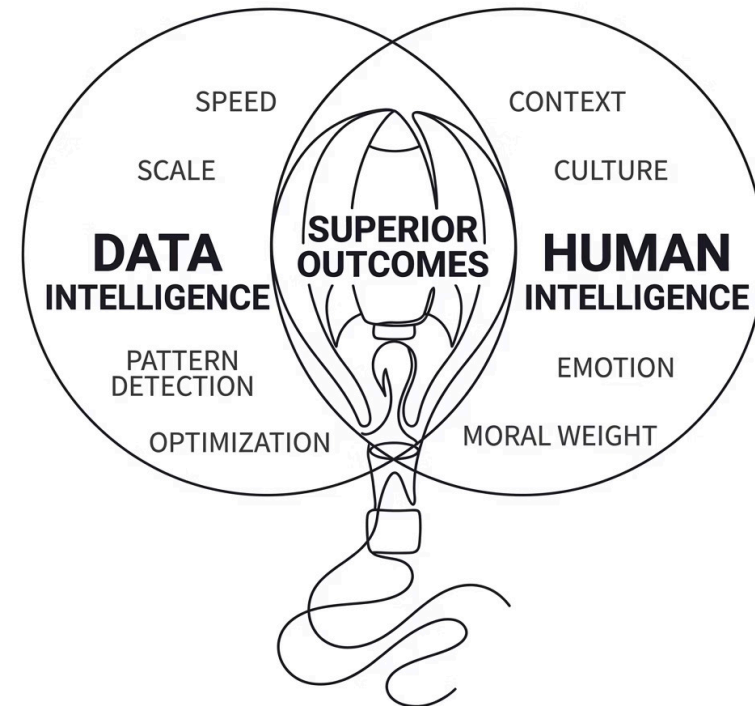


Balancing Data with Intuition & Context

The Numbers

A McKinsey study found that **executives who blend analytical data with contextual intuition** outperform purely data-driven peers in complex environments by a significant margin. Numbers tell you *what* happened. Leaders decode *why* it matters.

Leadership Agility in Dynamic Environments



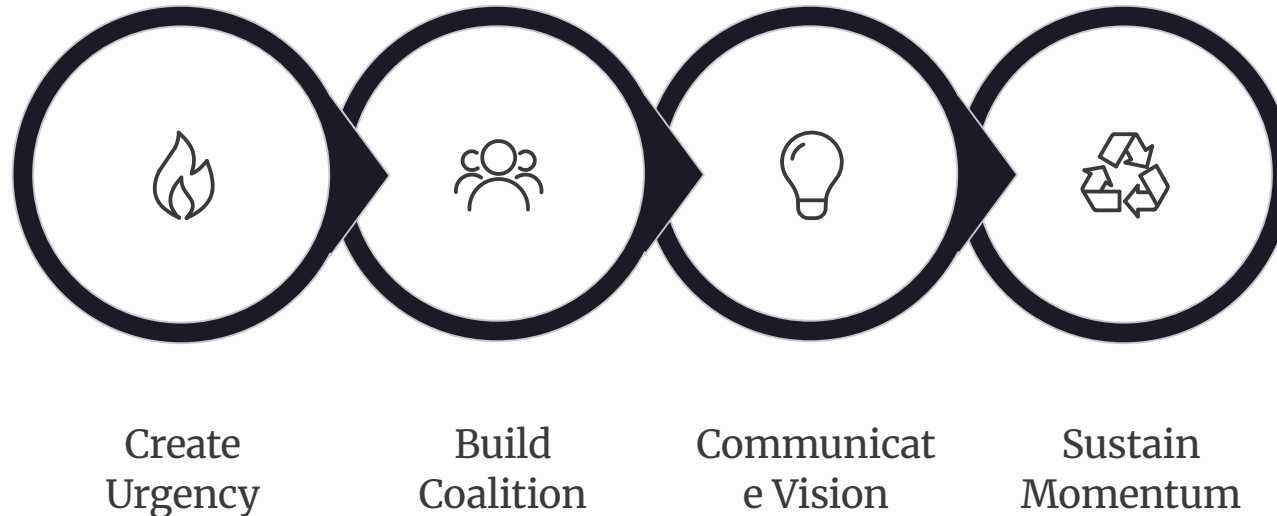

Change & Transformation Leadership

High-Performance Teams in Hybrid Settings

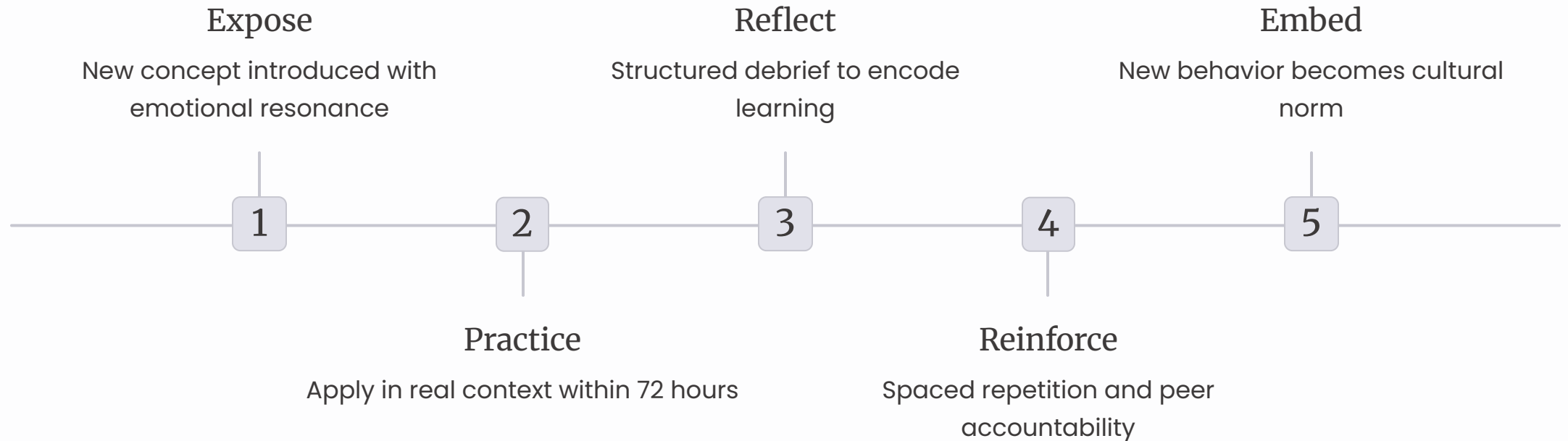
