**June GLPA membership meeting is
Tuesday, June 16 at 7 p.m. at the
Warren County Municipal Center room 5-110**

Mark Your Calendars for Three Important Dates:

- (1) **Monday, June 15 Herbicide Treatment.** (weather permitting) Our lake management firm will spot treat areas of the lake with the herbicide Clearcast to control Eurasian Watermilfoil and nuisance Illinois Pondweed that are growing fast and furious. The herbicide will restrict lake water used for irrigation until sample analysis reveals herbicide concentrations are <1ppb, and lake water used for drinking until concentrations are <50ppb. This should take about two weeks.
- (2) **Thursday, July 16 Planning Board special meeting for Cole's Collision project.** While Cole's has not submitted revised plans to date, we have to be prepared to attend and speak out once again against the project that threatens Glen Lake and our neighborhoods. We will have more information to share at our membership meeting.
- (3) **Tuesday, June 16 GLPA membership meeting.**

Please, please stay outside the buoyed areas. The buoys are there to keep activity out of the areas that have milfoil and other invasive plants. Recently, there has been increased activity inside the buoys. There are large and dense milfoil beds and other invasives in there, and milfoil and invasives spread by fragmentation and seeds. Activity in those areas – fishing, boating, even small electronic motors, swimming and kayaking – disturb the plants and the fragments and seeds are then spread throughout the lake. Please help us maintain the health of our beautiful lake by staying outside the buoys. Thank you.

Glen Lake Etiquette: (1) Please don't feed the waterfowl – geese and ducks. It is bad for them and bad for our lake. (2) Be aware that sound travels unimpeded over water; please be mindful of your volume and activities on the water. (3) Light also travels. Please minimize your use of outdoor lighting and boat docking lights. (4) Remember that anyone operating a motorboat or PWC must carry a NYS Boater's Safety Certificate with them on the lake. (5) Please inform your guests of boating rules and lake etiquette.
