Ice is out! Spring is here! It's time to get ready for the 2026 summer season. Our first membership meeting is Tuesday, April 21 at 7 p.m. at the Warren County Municipal Center room 5-110. The main agenda item will be an update and ongoing discussion of the proposed Cole's Collision Center at the corner of Glen Lake and Route 9. Cole's has submitted a revised site plan with an even larger building, 1,500 square feet larger, than the originally proposed structure. This project poses serious environmental threats to Glen Lake and just does not fit into the character of the neighborhood. So once again we need to come out in numbers and join our neighbors to voice our opposition. Please mark your calendar: the special Planning Board meeting for the Cole's project is THURSDAY, APRIL 23 at 7 p.m. at the Queensbury Activity Center 742 Bay Rd.

2026 Aquatic Plant Management: Permits to control invasive and nuisance aquatic vegetation have been submitted to the NYSDEC. Detailed information on potential treatment areas and dates will be provided and discussed at the April meeting.
