GLPA Meeting May 23

Our first GLPA membership meeting will be Tuesday, May 23 at 7 p.m. at the Queensbury Activity Center, 742 Bay Rd, Queensbury NY 12804. At the May meeting we will have information on 2023 aquatic plant management, a presentation on the water level, the status of our Watershed Manage Plan, why we are not yet in the list of lakes to receive septic installation grants, and several other important lake matters. We strongly suggest that you attend our meetings in-person; remember that a member has to be physically present at meetings to vote. Keep Out Buoys: Thanks to Sue Herlihy for storing our buoys overwinter. Thanks to Margaret Wallace for making the new "Keep Out" sleeves. Thank you to Pete Accardi and Margaret for putting the buoys in on May 12. Remember, the buoys are there because invasive aquatic plants are present in those areas. Many invasives spread by fragmentation, and activities in those regions cause fragmentation. Therefore, we ask that all boats and PWCs stay outside of the buoys. Thank you.

New York State will require all boaters to complete a certified Boating Safety Course. Those born on or after January 1, 1983 need a boating safety certificate now. Those born on or after January 1, 1978 will need the certificate beginning 2024, and all boaters regardless of age will need the boating safety certificate beginning 2025. Classroom courses or online options can be found at this link <https://parks.ny.gov/boating/safety-courses.aspx>. At our meeting, we will discuss a possible class just for Glen Lakers.

Reminders: Sound travels unimpeded over water; please keep the music at a reasonable volume. Please don't feed the waterfowl – ducks, geese, etc.; it's bad for them and bad for our lake. Please inform your renters of the boating rules and Glen Lake etiquette.
