General Membership Meeting
JUNE 14, 2021

Board members present: Paul McPhillips, Ron Mackowiak, Ryan Windelspecht, Linda Clark, Michele Mayer, Paul Derby, Ron Kuhl, Sue Herlihy and Margaret Wallace.

Zoom meeting opened at 7:05 pm by President Paul McPhillips. 24 members attended.

Secretary's report: Motion made by Sue and seconded by Paul D to accept the 5/10/21 minutes which are posted on glenlakeny.org.

President's report:

Algae: Dave Hodgeson said the green filamentous algae we're seeing is Spirogyra. It's not dangerous and will dissipate. The large amount is due to a "perfect storm" of weather factors this Spring.

Bill Miller's board seat: Paul M selected Pam Cembrook to replace Bill and it was approved by the Board. Pam spoke a few minutes to introduce herself to membership.

Virginia Etu's board seat will open up in August. Virginia is not running again. Anyone interested in running should contact Nominating Committee (Paul M, Paul D or Sue Herlihy).

Membership report: Linda gave 2020 summary: 188 households out of 367 responded (52%). 188 primary members and 144 secondary members. Money collected in 2020: \$5200 dues. \$9600 Lake maintenance, \$250 memorials for a total of \$15,050.00.

Paul M said we're looking into electronic payments.

Glen Lake Road cleanup was done 5/22/21. Paul M thanked participants. He also thanked Kerry from Glenmore who provided homemade bagels.

Treasurer's report: Ryan said only activity in May was \$2.38 interest posting. He'll give a full written report for May and June at July meeting.

Environmental Committee:

Invasive species mitigation: Paul D said there's very little milfoil but a lot of Illinois pondweed and curly leaf pondweed. SOLitude will treat 16-18 acres of the Lake tomorrow (6/15) with Aquathol Super K. No swimming or irrigation for 1 day. Potable water restrictions will be about 2 weeks-dependent on water tests. Information will be posted on our website.

Even though milfoil is down, we still need to stay out of buoyed areas.

Margaret said handpulling will be 2 weeks in Aug and 1 week in Sept. It will cover both milfoil and pondweed.

Bill Merritt asked if there was correlation between where ACC tests show eColi and weed growth. Paul D said if you overlaid the 2 maps, there's no correlation. Inlets have higher natural nutrients because of inflow of water.

Bill Mansmann asked about **floating dock restrictions**. Paul D said he's pretty sure moored items can't be more than 40 feet out into Lake.
