No swimming the day of the treatment and no potable water uses until water tests are at 50 parts per billion. Watch your email and go to our website glenlakeny.org for additional information.

NYS Boating Safety Course requirement: All motorboat operators, including PWCs (jetskis), will be required to have a boating safety certificate beginning January 1, 2025. Lake Etiquette Reminders: (1) Please don't feed the waterfowl – ducks, geese, etc.; it's bad for them and bad for our lake. (2) **Please stay outside of the buoyed areas** at the inlet, in St. Mary's Bay, and off Windmill Point; The buoys are there because invasive aquatic plants are present and invasives spread by fragmentation caused by boating activities in those areas. (3) Remember that sound travels unimpeded over water; please be mindful of the volume of your music and activities on the water. (4) Please inform your renters of boating rules and these community concerns.
