## WATER QUALITY NEWS

During this time of year we will be meeting with our Environmental consultant Solitude to review their end of season lake survey and plan a course of action for next year that we will present to DEC and hopefully receive their approval of our plan.

We will also be meeting with the folks at SUNY ADK to review our third full year of water testing. We hope to have a full presentation to

the Membership for our May 2021 meeting. Let's hope we can get together for that.

We are also in the process of trying to choose a consultant for our Glen Lake Watershed Management Plan. DEC and the Town of Queensbury are encouraging the GLPA to update the previous management plan that was completed many years ago. This plan will help us take a more complete look at the whole Glen Lake Watershed, rather than just the lake itself. This Plan will help us to determine and prioritize long term policies and practices that will guide us in protecting the long term health of Glen Lake. We will keep you fully informed of our progress as we move along on this process.
