Herbicide treatment scheduled for Tuesday, June 6, weather dependent. Access our website <https://glenlakeny.org/> for details.

16 acres of the lake will be treated with the herbicide Aquathol K to control invasive aquatic plants. Water use restrictions include: no swimming or bathing until the day after the application; no fishing during the application; no potable water use until the concentration drops below 50 part-per-billion (ppb). Water samples will be taken one week after the application to determine ppb. The samples are then sent to a lab, and it can take a week or more to obtain the results. The GLPA website will post when the potable use restrictions are lifted. If needed, the GLPA can provide drinking water.

Our next GLPA membership meeting will be Tuesday, June 13 at 7 p.m. at the Queensbury Activity Center, 742 Bay Rd, Queensbury NY 12804. We strongly suggest that you attend our meetings in-person; remember that a member needs to be physically present at meetings to vote. Reminders: (1) We ask that all boats and PWCs stay outside of the “Keep Out Buoys.” The buoys are there because invasive aquatic plants are present there, and invasives spread by fragmentation. Boating activities in those regions cause fragmentation. (2) Sound travels unimpeded over water; please keep the music at a reasonable volume. (3) Please don’t feed the waterfowl – ducks, geese, etc.; it’s bad for them and bad for our lake. (4) Please inform your renters of the boating rules and Glen Lake etiquette.
