**July GLPA membership meeting is
Tuesday, July 21 at 7 p.m. at the
Warren County Municipal Center room 5-110**

Cole's Collision meeting is rescheduled to Thursday, August 27. I am sorry to report that the Cole's Car Collision project proposed at the corner of Glen Lake Rd and Route 9 is not going away. On Monday July 6, I observed a crew taking soil/core samples for a new geotechnical analysis. Recall that their original geotechnical study showed that there are substantial amounts of unstable soils that couldn't be built on and would all need to be removed. The next morning, I saw two men with clipboards counting traffic at that intersection. It will be interesting to see what these new studies show. **The rescheduled special Planning Board meeting for the Cole's project has been set for Thursday, August 27 @ 7 pm at the Queensbury Activity Center 742 Bay Rd. Please mark your calendars and attend.** We must keep up the pressure to oppose a car repair and collision center adjacent to the Critical Environmental Area of our Glen Lake inlet wetland, and this industrial project is completely out of character with our neighborhoods. We will keep everyone informed of new information, and we will have two GLPA meetings (July 21 and August 17) before the Cole's meeting so we can discuss the project.

Herbicide Treatment follow up. Three weeks ago, areas of the lake were treated with the herbicide Clearcast to manage nuisance Illinois Pondweed and Eurasian Watermilfoil. This slow-acting herbicide takes about 4 weeks for the plants to fall out, and we are still seeing very active milfoil plants and seeded pondweed. So, again, we ask that people please stay outside the buoyed areas, as fragments and seeds get spread throughout the lake by activity in those areas. Additionally, there are dense Eurasian milfoil beds in the inlet and along the buoyed area at the outlet that likely will not be completely controlled, so we need to stay away from those beds. Water samples to determine concentration levels below water-use thresholds were taken at week two, per the protocol, but due to the lab's extended July 4th holiday those results will not be available until the end of this week. We will post the results will be posted on our website (glenlakeny.org) and Facebook page.

GLPA Nominations and Elections: the nominating committee presented a slate of open GLPA elected positions at the June meeting. That slate includes two-year positions for Paul

Derby for President and Linda Clark for Membership Secretary, and three-year Director positions for Ron Kuhl and Jay Ogden. Additional nominations can be taken from the floor, in-person at the July 21 GLPA Membership meeting. Elections will be held at the August 17 picnic meeting.

GLPA meeting date changes: The July membership meeting is now Tuesday, July 21 @ 7 pm at the Warren County Municipal Center room 5-110. The August Annual Picnic Meeting will be Monday, August 17 at 6 pm at the common area on Readon Rd, as per the last few years. More on the picnic later.

Glen Lake Etiquette: (1) Please don't feed the waterfowl – geese and ducks. It is bad for them and bad for our lake. (2) Be aware that sound travels unimpeded over water; please be mindful of your volume and activities on the water. (3) Light also travels. Please minimize your use of outdoor lighting and boat docking lights. (4) Please stay outside the buoyed areas. (5) Remember that anyone operating a motorboat or PWC must carry a NYS Boater's Safety Certificate with them on the lake. (6) Please inform your guests of boating rules and lake etiquette.
