

Format & Scoring Sheet

Teams are responsible for arranging the date and time of their first two matches. All matches must start on Hole #1. If you plan on purchasing any percentage of your team, you <u>MUST</u> make payment to the Pro Shop or Team Owner *PRIOR* to your first match. Commitment envelopes are available in the Pro Shop.

Tournament Format

Handicaps are applied by stroking off of the lowest handicap in the foursome. This is an example of how the handicaps would be followed:

| Team 1 | Strokes | Team 2 | Strokes |
|------------------------|---------|------------------------|---------|
| Player A - 8 handicap | 0 | Player C - 10 handicap | 2 |
| Player B - 11 handicap | 3 | Player D- 13 handicap | 5 |

The lowest handicap person in the foursome receives no strokes, while the other players receive the difference in handicaps. As always, the strokes you do receive will land on the toughest ranked handicapped holes.

This is a 2-person hi-low net game which essentially means there are two head to head matchups on each hole thus up to 2 points per hole are possible. The low net score on team 1 plays the low net score on team 2. The high net score on team 1 plays the high net score on team 2. For example, scores on the 1st Hole are:

| Team 1 | Net | Team 2 | Net |
|-----------|-----|---------|-----|
| Strafford | 3 | Hubbell | 6 |
| Colburn | 6 | Johnson | 4 |

Strafford and Johnson must play as the low nets on the hole: 3 beats 4 ⇒ Team 1 gets 1 point. Colburn and Hubbell must play as the high nets on the hole: 6 ties 6 ⇒ No points exchanged. Strafford/Colburn are now 1 point up heading to Hole #2.

You should keep a running total per hole so you know where your match stands at all times. If after 18 holes your match is tied, you must continue in sudden death playoff until the tie is broken.

Make sure you check in with the proshop so they can post the winner and loser in the correct brackets on the scoreboard sheets. If you have any questions please feel free to contact your Golf Professional. Most of all, have fun!
