This year at Acorn I have really enjoyed moving into the digital arena, we've served new people and I've enjoyed the challenge of something new.

STRATEGIC DEVELOPMENT

In 2017/18 we took the decision to establish 4 regional Acorn centres, over a five-year period, and this remains an essential part of our vision to operate as a national agency in promoting the Christian Healing ministry in its full expression. This decision was prompted by the need to ensure that Acorn did not remain 'southern-centric' but could develop meaningful access to its ministry across the UK. The initial intention was that from a strong central base we would be able to resource another four regional centres.

With the strategy taking a significant and unexpected turn during 2018/19 due to Acorn moving out of its residential base, the way in which we approached the strategy of establishing 4 regional centres over a five-year period needed to be reviewed. Our regular events found homes in Surrey-based venues – St Alban's Church in Hindhead, and Guildford Cathedral. In 2019, regular evening healing services were being held in partnership with Emmanuel Church, Guildford. The decision to stop Recalibrate and Healing Life's Wounds in Haslemere was made in Spring 2019 so that more of a focus could be given to Acorn's regular events.

Our leadership continued to build on natural relationships across the UK to establish regional bowls. Locations that we began to build on were Cornwall, Essex, and Leicester. As well as this, our listening training had the team providing events across the UK, with regular events taking place with organisations in Luton and Birmingham. Like this, Wes accepted an invitation to a conference as a Keynote Speaker from the Order of St Luke in Australia.

Towards the end of 2019, a natural opportunity and relationship with contacts in Leicester Diocese gave us the opportunity to run regular events at St Martin's House, a conference and events venue run by the Diocese of Leicester. This was part of the strategy of implementing the first of four bowls nationally. Starting in January 2020, Acorn was providing a second School of Healing every first Saturday of the month in Leicester.

STRATEGIC DEVELOPMENT

Due to unforeseen circumstances with COVID-19, we were no longer able to meet in person and all events were moved to digital platforms. The circumstances, which have proven to be long term, have meant that the bowl strategy has had to be reshaped. Regular events began to be produced for online running and distribution, as well as new relevant events and training being written and delivered, especially in response to the way that COVID-19 is impacting people's lives.

Once beginning this new way of providing events and resources, it was recognised by the staff and Trustees that Acorn was **meeting a wider demographic**, **providing more events**, **and being more accessible to others**.

The Board of Trustees agreed that developing the digital aspect of Acorn would be beneficial to the charity as well as those who use its resources, both nationally and internationally. This is an area that will continue to be developed whatever the direction of COVID-19 takes the country, and a focus that can help Acorn reach its vision of having regional 'bowls' (ministry centres) across the UK.

The support of all of our donors has meant that we have been able to develop the digital production and delivery of our resources, a very crucial step for Acorn in the current climate.



OPERATIONAL CHANGES

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Naturally, with life being interrupted this year for everyone, we have had to adapt accordingly.

We succeeded within a matter of a few weeks from national lockdown in March to provide the following events regularly, online via Zoom and YouTube:

- **Live @11** (previously held at St Alban's Church, Hindhead)

- **Two, monthly Schools of Healing** (previously held at Guildford Cathedral and St Martin's House, Leicester)

- **Listening training modules** open to the public and for private bookings (previously held for private groups only)

- New ministry events every other month
- Weekly podcasts
- Daily meditations and free downloads

- Online staff meetings and volunteer prayer meetings
- Purchasable downloads.

Since operating digitally, we have been working in more **diverse locations** both around the UK and internationally. It feels wise, and more effective, to provide easily accessible resources that people can access from the comfort of their own home or chosen location.

Operating digitally still allows us to respond to invitations from organisations, either by running private bookings online, going to their venue (when safe to do so), and by joining digitally.

In June 2020, Jo Walker, who many of you know well, reduced her hours to three days a week. Jo has served faithfully for many years at Acorn and she continues to serve with such joy and compassion, while now also being able to spend more time with her growing family.

As well as this, we were thrilled to have freelance Photographer, Chris Orange, join the team in May 2020 on a temporary contract. Chris has played a crucial part in developing the digital production of Acorn and we are so grateful for his expertise. Without his time and knowledge, we would not be able to provide all that we have this year. Your support has also made it possible for chris to be on the team during this season - for that, and for you, we are grateful.

AREAS OF ENCOURAGEMENT


AREAS OF ENCOURAGEMENT


ACHIEVEMENTS

Just <u>some</u> of our achievements this year.

Guildford Healing Conference 2020 - what a wonderful time! With around 150 guests attending. as well as guest speakers, Bishop James Newcome (Bishop of Carlisle and Acorn's Patron), and Rev Paul Harcourt (Director of New Wine UK), the day was greatly received by all. Topics such as healing and the NHS, wellbeing, listening, nurturing mental health, and healing stories; guests left with a toolkit in ministry and skills for the journey of Christian healing. We enjoyed working alongside the Diocese of Guildford and Guildford Cathedral, strengthening an already joyful partnership.

Delivered a seminar at New Wine Conference 2019 - Wes spoke at the New Wine Conference on Reconciliation, a great opportunity for us to be exposed to a wider demographic.He had a great time!

Successfully launched and established a second School of Healing in central England – We are thrilled to have started this school in Leicester once a month (now taking place online due to social restrictions). This location makes the event more accessible for many people who are familiar with Acorn.



ACHIEVEMENTS

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Established evening Healing Services to facilitate access for those working or with day time commitments – Until national lockdown in March, we had been running two, evening services - one in Hindhead and one in Guildford. Both these services have strengthened new partnerships within Guildford Diocese and have provided a service that guests can attend who couldn't necessarily attend a day time service. We are aware that many who were previously attending are now tuning in online to Live @11.

Acorn's Training Programme available online, both live and via downloads – this is now fully available online, live and downloadable, with further digital downloads in production.

Developed a fresh resource for churches supporting people with anxiety – We ran our first live, digital resource called 'Do Not Be Anxious' in 2020. Around 20 guests attended, and it is a resource that we aim to run again in the future.

Expanded the Acorn Volunteer Team – we are pleased to say that we have had four new individuals join the prayer team, all who are actively serving Acorn and those we are in contact with.

Responded to the restrictions that COVID-19 caused - as mentioned before, we have successfuly managed to provide all of our regular events and resources throughout the pandemic, while continually developing our operations. We are humbled by the guest feedback during this year.

2021 DEVELOPMENT

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Some of our focus areas for 2021, while still providing our core events and resources.

- Provide a new digital resource, introducing you to the Christian healing ministry. In nine, one hour online sessions we take a look at some of the key issues that we all encounter when we minister in Jesus' name. Available from April 2021 as a downloadable resource that you can access at a time that suits you, as an individual or part of a group. More details to follow soon!
- Acorn Multisite we will be providing events that you can access as part of your community or as an individual, alongside other groups across the country and the world! We will provide training on a number of topics relating to Christian healing from a central location, which you can access via Zoom with your group. The beauty of this event delivery is that when it comes to the times of ministry, you will be able to minister to one another in your group with people you know - putting into practice what we've been learning!
- Equip volunteers to deliver online training on behalf of Acorn we have been working with a number of volunteers to work with us on delivering Acorn ministry and training, we are so grateful for their willingness and look forward to you meeting them at some of our events.
- Develop and shape our events to fit well with both the digital and face to face elements. It's really important to us that all of our events are accessible, so we are continually working on the development of the ministry so that it is accessible and effective when we are able to safely meet in person.







"Even during a season of severe difficulty and tremendous suffering, they became even more filled with joy". 2 Corinthians 8:3

It has been a challenging, difficult year for everyone. We understand that you, and your friends and family may have lost jobs, are battling health issues, and have been seperated from family this year. We are in a season of difficulty, and for some - suffering. Even popping to the shops for milk has become more difficult! Our anchors have been removed and we are having to sail in new waters.

During this season at Acorn we desire to first dedicate ourselves fully to the Lord. By His grace we are able to serve with abundant joy and be generous towards others in ministry. Because of your gracious generosity we are able to walk with individuals and communities in their crisis and hardships, while also equipping others to do the same. We are seeing hope restored in people's lives, physical healings take place, and people feeling confident and equipped to minister healing to others in Jesus' name.

You may not be able to support Acorn financially this Christmas, and that is okay!

2 Corinthians 8 draws us into a joyful understanding of giving and generosity, especially in times like this, and it has helped us as a team sail the new waters with a little more ease. There's two life giving nuggets that are highlighted in this passage, let's take a quick look (we are going to go backwards!).

1. Dedicate ourselves fully to the Lord (8:5-7)

The Macedonians **first** dedicated themselves fully to the Lord, and then to the ministry. Generosity came from the overflow of their joy in the Lord; and where the generosity is distributed to came second.

2. Out of crisis, joy and generosity privailed (8:3-5)

How were they able to give with "extravagant generosity" in a time of crisis? They knew the grace unto them by God and in an act of worship to Him desired to extend this to others - "superabundant joy overflowed into an act of extravagant generosity". The circumstances didn't stop their generosity because the joy of the Lord was greater. The amount was not necessary, for "if the intention and desire are there, the size of the gift doesn't matter". (vs 12). Maybe this enabled them to give so joyfully?



Our prayer for you and for Acorn this Christmas is that in first dedicating ourselves fully to the Lord we may know His joy; and may that joy overflow into generosity! Generosity that reveals the goodness of God to others and draws them into His presence.



How Can I Help?

The affects of COVID-19 were unexpected and have been long lasting for us at Acorn, like they have been for many. We are continually adapting and developing as a charity based on new Government and medical advice, as well as to the needs of those that we interact with. However, in the difficulties that we have faced, we have been amazed and humbled by the grace of God.

We thought that it would be helpful to share with you how COVID-19 has affected Acorn, and how your support can enable us to continue being generous to others.

- **Unable to hold events in person since mid March 2020.** For many, our regular ministry events are a source of **community and fellowship**. Many who attend fall into the vulnerable people group and became very isolated. It is important to us to make sure that the regular ministry events and resources are available online so that individuals feel connected again. Your financial support means that we can provide accessible events and resources online.

- Did you know that to produce and provide online resources, almost each resource requires it's own software subscription? As well as these costs, there are new licensing and equipment costs that we didn't have before. When you attend a paid event or make a donation to Acorn it helps pay towards the running costs of our resources.


- Additional staff. As mentioned in our Annual Report, to be able to provide quality digital events and resources, and to be able to develop moving forward, we have hired a freelance Photographer who has the knowledge and expertise to help us become more accessible. Without Chris being on the team during this season and as we move into the New Year, we would have struggled to deliver ministry and skills for the journey of Christian healing. Thanks to Chris being on the team, and your support, we are able to improve our presence and ministry in response to the current climate.


- Some Charitable Trusts have reduced their financial support. COVID-19 has effected everyone financially, and in response to this some of the regular Charitable Trusts that support us had to reduce their giving. This meant that we have had to find other ways of producing the income that we had originally budgeted. As a charity, we do not make profit, so we have not increased the price of our events or resources. Instead we have aimed to provide more events in a short amount of time, and this takes its toll on the team. We have had to look at the calendar for 2021 and only schedule in what we can realistically achieve. The generosity that you share with us will mean that we don't need to try and function on overdrive, and potentially cause burn out among the team.

- Bookings prior to lockdown were cancelled. Thankfully not all, but some! Not all groups want to run their training event via Zoom and would rather wait until it's safe to meet in person, resulting in cancelled bookings. Unfortunately this means that the forecast income for Acorn has been affected. When you choose to donate to Acorn, you are helping these occurances hit us a little lighter.

- Expenditure will increase. As we head into 2021 and hopefully able to meet in person, our expenditure will increase. We will have venue hire, travel, and equipment costs (plus others!), in addition to our current operational costs. It is important to us to continue both digitally as well as face to face. The new costs that we have incurred this year will not go when we can meet face to face. The donations that you make to Acorn will enable us to provide **multiple** access points to Acorn's ministry - Digital, Face to Face, and Multisite. We believe that this will make our ministry accessible to more people across the world.
