I would like to mention another service we offer that seems to be a little confusing to folks. That is the handi-bus service we provide. To clarify, you may ride the bus from your home to lunch and back to your home after lunch for free. However, if you stop anywhere other than your home after lunch it is considered a new ride and you need to pay the \$4 round trip fee. The \$2 per trip is not a suggested donation but an actual fee to be collected. The fees collected go towards gas, licensing and maintenance of the bus. We are happy to provide this service, but it can only continue if the bus can support itself.


