## Here's a message from our Head of Service, John:

Hello and welcome to our first quarterly newsletter! 2022 was a challenging year for many, including the charity. Our ambulance broke down, we had a massive overhaul of our policies and guidelines, and we had many many sleepless nights trying to get our brand new building and treatment center open. Without the incredible dedication of our volunteers, none of these things would have been finished by now. 2022 was also a year full of productivity, progression, and growth. We managed to get our building up and running, which was a massive task with many moving parts. All of our volunteers can say they've played a part in shaping our building into what it is. We purchased more equipment for our volunteers and lots more consumable stock to ensure we are in a position where we'll always have spare. We purchased and installed an entire computer network and server, and our brand new sponsor, Prime Secure, installed all of our security cameras and doors making sure our volunteers and patients are safe while delivering care. We are also in the process of updating our patient record system. This will ensure we meet strict compliance and clinical governance standards that would rival the best medical companies. Also, our Education and Mentorship team had 4 student paramedics complete their placements with us. There's definitely not enough space to list everything from last year! The biggest achievement for us was our 2nd birthday in October. It's amazing to think of all the things we have achieved over the last two years and I couldn't be prouder of all the volunteers who help make this charity operate and support the people of Glasgow every weekend, on their own time. I'm very excited for what 2023 will bring and I hope you all come along with us! - John

## The Building

After months of hard labour, early mornings, late nights, and some extraordinary work from our volunteers and sponsors, the Glasgow Street Aid building opened on the 9th of December 2022. We now have a safe space to bring patients and a home base for our volunteers. A huge thank you to Prime Secure, Astro Flooring, Daniel's Healthcare, Rape Crisis Scotland and all of our contractors for your support and donations which helped make this all possible.

Our new building allows our volunteers to bring patients into a bright, clean, warm, and safe environment and treat them in a clinically safe way. It also gives our volunteers a safe place to monitor and treat patients, provide advice and guidance, support vulnerable people get the help they need, and give our partners such as Police Scotland, Street Pastors, and the Scottish Ambulance Service a place to bring people for medical treatment or even a cup of tea. The building has 5 bays with Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs), cardiac monitoring, and observational equipment. We can deal with emergencies alert the Scottish Ambulance Service when required. It is also fully stocked with consumables for wound care.

The building also houses the charity's head office and control room. Our control room is now open for calls mainly on Friday and Saturday by calling our main charity number 0141 212 9271. When you call us, you will hear an automatic menu, please pick the appropriate service you require. If you are letting us know about a patient, you will speak with one of our control room's volunteers who will take the details, ask some pertinent questions, and dispatch the nearest available street team to your location. Anyone can still approach us on the street if you see us, but if we are not around, please call the number above. We have a limited number of volunteers on shift on a Sunday night, therefore it may take longer for you to reach us, but please still give us a call and, if nobody answers, please leave a voicemail and we will get back to you as soon as possible.

On the 17th of December 2022, some of our volunteers took part in our yearly Christmas Fundraising Day on Buchanan Street/Gordon Street. Our fundraising day allows us to purchase the necessary medical equipment for our volunteers, ambulance, and our building. ## **Our Statistics**



Right, let's get down to statistics. We all know the winter months in Scotland aren't the best, and with our volunteers wishing to spend more time with their family and friends over the festive period, we managed to rack up a whopping 1682 hours. We want to say a massive thank you to all of you for braving the cold and helping the people of Glasgow.

Here at Glasgow Street Aid, we record all our data regarding the patients that we see, and break them down into subcategories:

Medical - the patient required medical attention.

Welfare - encompasses a variety of different circumstances from helping people find their way in the city centre, to more serious incidents such as helping victims of domestic violence and vulnerable people to a place of safety.

Aggression - incidents of abuse, violence, and aggression towards our volunteers.

As well as these categories, we also include the total amount of overdoses that our volunteers attended in which they were required to administer Naloxone.

So, here are the figures for last quarter (Oct-Dec'22):

Medical - 259 of which 4 were overdoses

Welfare - 111

**Aggression** - 10

Total logs - 380
