


With a mixed cycle of snow/rain and extended dry periods this winter and a spring growth of flowers and grasses, along with spring winds, the risk of fire remains very present in and around Flagstaff. Summer monsoon storms with lightening also contribute to overall community fire risk.

It is very important for residents and guests to be mindful of all behaviors that might increase the risk of fire. It is imperative, for the safety of our community, homes and surrounding area, that all homeowners be especially mindful of fire risk throughout the spring, summer and fall season. Please be especially attentive when grilling or using tools that could cause sparks. Per the CC&Rs, open fires are prohibited and charcoal fires on decks are prohibited. Natural gas, propane and electric grills are allowed but must be used with caution. Fireworks and similar are prohibited at all times.

Additionally, residents and guests who smoke cigarettes and other smoking materials are reminded that it is <u>imperative at all times that matches</u>, <u>cigarettes and smoking materials are disposed of properly</u>.
