Homeowners are also reminded that with the advent of spring and summer, we all must be extra vigilant about activities that might be a cause for fire danger. A new sign has been installed at the entrance to the community to remind all residents, guests and vendors to take caution and care within our special community.

The Board of Directors knows that during the spring/summer season, many homeowners will be thinking about and planning home improvement projects. Homeowners are strongly advised to contact the property manager before scheduling and beginning any projects in order to determine if an Architectural Request document is required to be completed, submitted and approved by the board prior to initiating any work. The ARC document can be found on the community website.

Our increasingly warm summers mean that many homeowners are considering installation of an AC unit. As with other home projects, an ARC form must be completed, submitted and approved by the board prior to installation. Specific AC requirement information can be found on the community website along with the required ARC form.

Lastly, homeowners are reminded that javelinas appear to be a regular fixture in Flagstaff, with frequent sightings within the immediate and broad neighborhood as well as on the golf course and with the CCC area. They are most active in the early morning and later afternoon/early evening. They view dogs as coyotes and will likely charge as a defense. They also do not have good eyesight so they may also charge people because they want to get away but don't know where they are going. Be alert and consider carrying a stick, especially if walking your dog (s).
