PASTOR'S PEN

There was a local congregation that built a new social hall. Before the building was finished, members of the congregation were invited to write scripture verses on the studs before the drywall went up. One person chose the shortest verse in the Bible: "Jesus wept." On the stud in the wall behind the men's room toilet is John 11:39 in the King James Version: "He stinketh."



We too have wept, as Jesus wept for Lazarus. It might surprise us a little that Jesus cried. Surely he knew about the resurrection of the dead. Surely Jesus knew his own power as the Lord and Giver of Life. However, in this particular moment Jesus seems overcome with grief. Death's sting hasn't been swallowed up in his Easter victory over the grave.

Lazarus's tomb could be a symbol for death and all the things of this world that "stinketh." The grave could represent depression, or addiction, or loneliness. Perhaps the tomb could be cancer, or a blot clot, or suicide. There are many things in this world that can cause us to despair and cry. Perhaps Jesus, in that instant, understood this. Jesus, God incarnate, the Word made flesh, came down from heaven to share our common lot. Our Lord experienced our pain and our suffering. Yes, he is the power to transform all of this into something new. He is our redemption, but he is also our Companion. He weeps our tears. He knows our pain, and he knows that sometimes things just plain stinketh! He does not stop there however. Into the darkest, deadest, most despairing of tombs in this world he stands firm at the entrance and yells: "Come out!" Yes Jesus knows our despair, but he is also ultimately our pathway out of despair into the abundance of life. Wherever forces of this world threaten to drain us of energy and all things that animate

us, he comes to open the tomb of our despair and summon us out into the fresh air of a new beginning.

Now all that is left is for you to reflect and ask yourself: "What in my life truly stinketh?" Take a moment now and bring whatever that is to mind. It could be your grief. Whatever is causing you pain, bring it here to Jesus. Now once you have this in mind, listen to his voice saying: "Come out!" What does it look like to come out of that thing in your life that stinketh Are you being called to let something or someone go? Let Jesus lead you. Follow the sound of his voice calling you out of your tomb to live again. Now think of those bandages that Lazarus was bound so tight with. Jesus calls out yet again and says: "Unbind him." What does it look like in your life to be unbound and set free? Then Jesus says: "Give him something to eat." Where are you being nourished for this new life, this new beginning? What or who feeds you? Is it a hobby? Is it exercise? Is it prayer? Whatever it is, receive it.

Make Giving Easy and Automatic. Here are two ways you can do that:






