As I think about the conversations I'm having lately, it is apparent that there is much to be anxious over, from politics to our personal lives, our minds can be consumed by worry. Several scriptures address worry and anxiety, offering comfort and guidance.; for example: Philippians 4:6-7 encourages believers to "be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Matthew 6:34 reminds us to focus on the present, stating, "Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble." Psalm 34:4 declares, "I sought the Lord, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears," highlighting God's willingness to help those who seek Him. 1 Peter 5;7 advises, "casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you," emphasizing God's concern for our burdens. Matthew 11:28-30 offers an invitation to find rest in Jesus, saying, "Come to me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

Nothing tests our faith like anxiety and worry. Scripture tells us we have a choice in our anxiety and worry to various degrees. Often times the greatest amount of worry comes in our everyday, personal lives.




It was a blessing to be out there again in the community and part of Norwood's 113th July 4th celebration!!! Think about joining in for next year if you can!! We'd love to have you!!
