

^PRAYER OF THE DAY

O God, you resist those who are proud and give grace to those who are humble. Give us the humility of your Son, that we may embody the generosity of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord Amen.

First Reading:

Sirach 10:12-18

The book of Sirach, like the book of Proverbs, is part of a collection of writings known as wisdom literature. In today's reading, the writer warns against the sin of pride, proclaiming that God will utterly overthrow the proud.

¹² The beginning of human pride is to forsake the Lord; the heart has withdrawn from its Maker. ¹³ For the beginning of pride is sin, and the one who clings to it pours out abominations. Therefore the Lord brought upon them unheard-of calamities and destroyed them completely. ¹⁴ The Lord overthrew the thrones of rulers and enthroned the lowly in their place. ¹⁵ The Lord plucked up the roots of the nations and planted the humble in their place. ¹⁶ The Lord laid waste the lands of the nations and destroyed them to the foundations of the earth. ¹⁷ He removed some of them and destroyed them and erased the memory of them from the earth. ¹⁸ Pride was not created for human beings or violent anger for those born of women.

- ¹⁰ The wicked will see it and be angry; they will gnash their teeth and pine away; the desires of the wicked will perish.

Hebrews 13:1-8, 15-16

The conclusion of the letter to the Hebrews contains suggestions for the conduct of a holy life, all of which are shaped by God's love toward us in Jesus Christ.

¹ Let mutual affection continue. ² Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. ³ Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with

them, those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

^HOLY GOSPEL

P: The Holy Gospel according to Luke the 12th Chapter

C: Glory to you O Lord

Jesus observes guests jockeying for position at the table. He uses the opportunity to teach his hearers to choose humility rather than self-exaltation. Jesus also makes an appeal for hosts to imitate God's gracious hospitality to those in need.

¹ On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the Sabbath, they were watching him closely. ⁷ When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable. ⁸ "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host, ⁹ and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. ¹⁰ But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. ¹¹ For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be

exalted."

¹² He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. ¹³ But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. ¹⁴ And you will be blessed because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."






DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION (By Intinction)


