Pastor's Pen

Luther's explanation of the first commandment is both simple and profound: "You shall have no other gods. What does this mean? We are to fear, love, and trust God above all things." Sounds easy, right? Put God first in your life. Let Jesus take the wheel. Make God your pilot (and not, as saying goes, merely your co-pilot). As people of faith, I believe that we really do want to put God first. But it's so hard to do this!

I confess that, on a daily basis, I love and trust other things more than God. Yes, God is still in the picture, but so often gets crowded out by all the everyday stuff. I love my wife, my family, my friends, my country, my congregation. Sometimes these loves overshadow my love for God. I confess that I trust my own memory, my own instincts and intuitions, my deeply held political commitments, and the news sources that reinforce the beliefs I already have. Sometimes, these things guide my decisions more than my trust in God alone—even though I should know better. I confess that I often worry about pleasing other people more than I worry about pleasing the Lord. I fear rejection, and environmental catastrophe, and nuclear war, and all sorts of other things—even though I know that perfect love casts out fear.

Perhaps you could make a similar confession of your failures to keep the first commandment. So, what then are we to do? In 1521, while Luther was still in hiding after his trial for heresy, he wrote this advice to his friend and colleague, Philip Melancthon:

"If you are a preacher of grace, then preach a true and not a fictitious grace; if grace is true, you must bear a true and not a fictitious sin. God does not save people who are only fictitious sinners. Be a sinner and sin boldly, but believe and rejoice in Christ even more boldly, for he is victorious over sin, death, and the world."

In other words, because we are human, we are going to sin whether we are churchgoers or not, whether we are Republicans or Democrats, whether we are apolitical or an activist, whether we are 'nice people' or not. But this is not a reason to despair. Luther urges us to make the best choices we can and act anyway, trusting that the grace of God is greater than we are.






Yard sale, and craft tables continue to create customers attention. Judy continues to do an amazing job in our kitchen with the help of Frank and Joe.

The Birth of Jesus

Luke 2:1-20

2 In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to their own town to register.

⁴ So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵ He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, ⁷ and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

⁸ And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

¹³Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.
