

## Happy 70<sup>TH</sup> Birthday to Immanuel Lutheran's Nativity Scene!

- The lumber to build the manger came from the old Norwood railroad station.
- The painting of the figures was done by Mrs. Fred Hazel who was an accomplished artist of the day.
- The first year the scene had the baby Jesus, Mary, a chicken and a squirrel. Then over the next several years they added Joseph, the donkey, sheep, the angel and the window. (Sadly the original chicken and squirrel have escaped!).
- Due to the labors of love to mend and erect the manger it continues to bring the Christmas spirit to Norwood
