PASTOR'S PEN

Cleansing the Temple. John 2:13-19: There is a striking difference between the marriage in Cana and this story at the temple in Jerusalem. At the wedding, Jesus was an invited guest who pleased the people. In the Jerusalem temple, Jesus was in uninvited stranger in his Father's house, whose display of anger and judgement shocked those in attendance.

Jesus referred to his body as a temple, meaning that it is the sanctuary of the living God. He said, "Destroy this temple and I will rise it again in three days." The apostle Paul understood our bodies to be the temple of the Holy Spirit. He wrote the Corinthians that they were to honor their bodies, both physically and spiritually. Paul taught that our bodies are to be a living example of disciplined holiness, that God might be revealed through us.

What do we find when we examine our lives? Are we a pure sanctuary that enables people to see and experience the love and power of Christ? We spend so much time on outer appearances, and devote little time to the inner life. Our New Year's resolutions are often focused obtaining the perfect body versus focusing on obtaining a perfect soul.

The Jerusalem temple was an architectural masterpiece that impressed those who came to worship. But the world of sin penetrated its courts, turning it into a storefront where profiteers gathered. As a result, it lost its spiritual life and purpose.

It is the Lord who created our temple, with all its uniqueness and multifaceted abilities. He has given us a soul that we might commune with him and be recipients of his love.





Message From Resource Committee

Immanuel is not just about worshipping on a Sunday morning. We are much more than that. We have programs at Immanuel. We reach out to the community. We open our doors to community groups.

Did you know that we have four NA groups who meet throughout the week. We have a Bereavement Group; Yoga; and a Cardio Exercise Group. We have opened our doors to a new group who train dogs. We have opened our doors to the Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts and Prospect Park Cheer Leading Team. The Messenger Motorcycle Club who support MVP Recovery Center and Parents of Murdered Children, Delaware County Chapter also meet here. These are all ways that Immanuel has reached out to the Community.

We have many programs happening for church members: Thursday night bible study; Sunday Morning bible study; Sunday School, and Youth Group. We host a Vacation Bible School in the summer that is open to the community.

We initiated a Fundraising Committee in 2018 – that also reaches out and includes the community; such as the Spaghetti Dinner and the Pancake Breakfast.

We have supported Loaves and Fishes, Lutheran World Hunger and Disaster Relief!

Immanuel is so much more than worshipping on Sunday mornings, which is also a fulfilling experience.



In order to keep Immanuel worshipping on Sundays, reaching out the community, and continuing our programs, we passed a budget at our Annual Meeting to continue all these activities. The projected income' however, will not meet the final expense budget; but, we are sure that we can make up that difference. Keeping in mind that our giving has increased and our 2019 deficit is less than last year. Let's keep this going!

For many years, Resource has run the "Insurance" and "Oil" campaign board to help make up that difference. We are so grateful for everyone that was able to help. In 2019 you will see that board disappear and a new one will appear to help decrease the deficit. There will be envelopes in the pews, marked "Erase the Deficit" which we ask you to put any extra money that you can give to Immanuel. **This would be in addition to your regular giving.** Maybe, you got a bonus? Maybe you hit the lottery? Maybe you can just spare some extra dollars at the end of the week or month? By using these envelopes, we can close the deficit and not dip into our investments. You will see updates on Erasing the Deficit with a new visual chart and updates in the newsletter.




