PASTOR'S PEN

The whole month of March will be dedicated to Lent and its traditions. We need traditions.

Traditions - especially with those children can see, hear, feel, smell and taste - provide vivid impressions on which parents can build year after year. There are many which will enrich your own family's celebration of what might be more accurately called Resurrection Day. Below are the most common Lenten practices, share their meaning in whatever words your children will understand, and keep the ones you like as part of your family's Easter heritage.

New Life: As Lent begins, help your children plant crocus, daffodil, or hyacinth bulbs in a bowl of sand, covering halfway. Leave in a dark closet for two months, keeping soil moist (a process known as forcing bulbs). When shoots appear, let them bask in the sun. Don't forget to leave one bulb unplanted as a reminder of how they began.



Devotions: Lent can be a time of family focus on the meaning of the Christian life. You may want to commit to a regular pattern of family worship - daily, weekly, or whenever you can. Or you may post Bible verses, on the refrigerator, bathroom mirrors, wherever a busy family is sure to see them. Talk about them at dinner or on the way to school - especially how verses apply to events in our daily lives.

Giving up: Traditionally, especially in Europe, during Lent there were no weddings, no dancing, no singing. No flowers or alleluias in churches. Some families may find spiritual value in giving up something for Lent - television, sweets, video games - not as a penance, but as an outer symbol of dying to self during a season of spiritual reflection.

Sundays, because they commemorate the Resurrection, are not counted. In the early church Lent was a special time when new converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism on Easter.

We will begin a new sermon series using the "Five Love Languages" in which we look at how Jesus uses each of the Love Languages in each week of our Gospel readings. Please join us March1st as we learn what our own love language is and how we benefit from knowing this information.



2020 Budget Update - "Oops, We made a Mistake"

During the Annual Congregation meeting we passed a 2020 budget of \$119,180.00 When processing the first payroll after that, it was discovered that *we made a mistake*. The Pastor's 2020 housing allowance was entered as \$33,321. **It should have been \$31,321.** This \$2000 overage then carried on through the rest of the budget.

If you go to your annual report here are the corrections to be made:

Page 30 Housing Allowance should be \$31,321.

Page 30 the subtotal for Pastoral Compensation should be \$41,467.

Page 31 the Total General Fund should be \$108,840.

Page 31 the Total Annual Budget should be \$117,180.

Page 32 the Total Budget should be \$117,180.

Page 32 the Difference/Deficit should be \$1,158.






