PASTOR'S PEN

The summer is a busy time, but, also a great time for soul care. Vacations and long weekends away, are a welcomed reconnection to people, places and stories that restore our souls. These times of relaxation also provide the perfect environment to nurture your relationship with God.

Faith is a pure gift; faith also takes practice. For most of us, noticing that God is near, remembering what God has done for us, and trusting in God's promises do not come automatically. Faith grows with repetition and challenge and discipline. Each of us is different, but here are some of the things that help me remember that Christ is truly risen--for me, for us, and for the whole creation:

- I recognize him in the breaking of the bread. Sometimes I am blown away by this. Even when I'm not feeling it myself, I still trust that Christ shows up in the sacrament. Let us be thankful for the food, company and conversation at the dinner table.
- Practice trying to perceive the face of Christ in all faces. Do you realize that sometimes you are downright radiant?
- I usually pay better attention to the presence of God when I am quiet and slow down. This seems to be true whether I am reading, praying, walking, working, or in conversation.
- Woods, water, and sky: Spending time in nature usually helps to restore my sense of awe, reduce my anxiety, see God's creation as beautiful, and revive my gratitude.
- Daily life in a relationship: Being forgiven, welcomed and accepted by other people helps me to trust more fully that God forgives, welcomes, and accepts me too.

I hope you explore the beauty of God's creation this summer.

In May the Property committee alerted us to this! We have slate pieces from our roof falling!

The Property Committee investigated with a slate roof specialist, who inspected our roofs. The repairs of the slate, plus 2 other items needing attention (Gutter repairs and Flat Roof maintenance), will cost about <u>\$5,350</u> and NEEDS TO BE DONE. We worked with Property and started a campaign to raise money for the

repairs. We need to start the repairs before more damage occurs. Please support this effort as we work together to care for our Lord's house.

What Else Can We Do? Especially Durning Vacation Time?

- Support our fund raisers especially the ongoing Food Gift Coupons.
- Give to our **ROOF REPAIR campaign** using the envelopes on the bright BLUE board.

- 2. **Tithely** Consider using the safe, secure, easy virtual method with the QR code with your smart phone. There are also buttons on our website and Facebook pages. Tithely can also set up a recurring, automatic monthly donation using one of your credit cards. There is a nominal fee with this.

The Power of Prayer ~ Steve King's Story

My dad, Steve King, has always been a strong, vibrant man. Even as he entered his eighties, he took great pride in maintaining his yard and garden, washing his cars, and staying very physically active. That all changed this past September. What originally started as a cough led to him losing the ability to swallow anything, even his own saliva! After spending almost the whole month of November hospitalized and down to 125lbs, he had a surgical procedure to close a hole between his esophagus and lung, and also had a feeding tube inserted.

It was around this time that a dear friend of mine (Judy) asked if I would like my dad to be added to the prayer list at Immanuel. I loved this idea and immediately said yes. It wasn't long before we started to see improvements in my dad. He started to gain weight, and began to swallow small amounts of fluid. He has continued to make improvements, and although he still has a feeding tube, he can now eat many soft foods. He is also back working in his garden! I totally believe that this is due to God's intervention and the power of prayer.

I can't express how thankful I am to the congregation at Immanuel for praying for my father. I'd also like to add that having an ill family member can feel very isolating. Knowing that there were other people praying with me for my dad, made me feel less alone. Thank you all! The spirit of God's love shines through the wonderful things you do!

Synod Assembly 2024



We Have Elected a New Bishop!

Pastor Lee and Karl McClellan represented Immanuel at this year's Synod Assembly with the primary piece of work being to elect a new Bishop since Bishop Davenport will be retiring.

The Rev. Bryan Penman, pastor of St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Conshohocken and co-Director for Evangelical Mission in the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod, was elected on as the synod's next bishop.

"I am so humbled that you believe in the work that we do together. This is not me, this is us...we are SEPA synod," Penman **told the assembly** following his election.

"This is the work that we do together...to continue to practice radical grace. To make sure that the world knows there is a place for them at the table, to know that God's grace goes to them because there is a lot of messaging in this world that tells them they are not enough. This church is alive. The Spirit is moving. And the Spirit will guide us into a more beautiful church than we can imagine." — Bishop-Elect Bryan Penman


