

This year March will kick off our Lenten journey. Ash Wednesday is March 2^{nd} . The ministerium will be holding a "drive by ashes" in the parking lot of St. Matthew Lutheran church. Similar to last year, we will have a short liturgy followed by the imposition of ashes.

Our midweek Lenten services will be via Zoom again this year. Our theme is Journey to the Easter Vigil. Something new we are trying this year will be an Easter Vigil.



March is full of activities to connect with God but also to connect with our family members in a fun activity. The paper puppet workshop was postponed from February to March due to Covid numbers.

Children and caregivers are invited to the Paper Puppet Workshops at Immanuel Lutheran Church. This unique opportunity will be led by the Segal Puppet & Theater Company, they will guide the participants through four weeks of fun beginning March 6! We will build puppets, create scripts and record puppet shows. Each 45-minute session will be held at the church on four consecutive Sundays at 1:00 pm. Historical Overview of Deacons

In February we celebrated the achievement of Joe Kintsche and Mary Lyn Horne-Onimus, I bet many of you are wondering "what is a congregational deacon?

The office of deacon stems most clearly from Acts 6, where seven men are appointed to a ministry of service as distinct from a ministry of Word and Sacrament. The term "deacon" stems from the Greek word "to serve" and so contains the idea of doing something for another. Not much is said in scripture about the actual duty of deacons. Both Stephen and Philip are described as proclaiming the Word. In the writings of the early church, the office of deacon indicates some involvement in the liturgy, often as an assistant to the bishop. As bishops became the leaders of groups of congregations, some deacons remained attached to a single congregation under the presbyter (i.e., pastor/priest).

The latter half of the 20th century saw a re-awakened interest in the office of deacon. A changing culture with new needs was met by emphasis on the people of God as having a servant role.

Synod has identified two arenas of lay ministry under the name of Deacon: Congregational and Conference Deacons. Joe and Mary Lyn are Congregational Deacons.

Congregational Deacon: Congregational Deacons are persons who, after two years of training, are recognized leaders within an intentional ministry in a congregation under the supervision of the Pastor.

Congregational Deacons may lead liturgy, assist, and/or preach in their own congregation or parish. **Congregational Deacons** may publicly proclaim the Word by a sermon they have prepared in accordance with their training and under the supervision of the Pastor, or read a sermon given them by the Pastor.

left. You can bring donations on Sunday morning or the church secretary can buzz you in the door during office hours, 9:00-1:00 most weekdays, except holidays.




