PASTOR'S PEN

Have you ever received an unexpected invitation to a party? You weren't expecting to be invited to such an event. You didn't realize that the host would want you there. Such invitations come as a surprise and a gift.

We read in the book of Acts of the Holy Spirit's invitation to Gentiles.

You see, in the early church people thought you had to be a member of the Jewish community first before you could follow Jesus. After all, Jesus' closest disciples were Jewish. How else would someone understand the traditions, customs, and the Hebrew Scriptures without first becoming a member of the Jewish community? Surely one had to be circumcised first before they could belong to the community. Only then



would they be considered worthy and prepared enough to receive baptism. As fate would have it, the Holy Spirit didn't seem to care much about our human rules and traditions of who is in and who is out. Instead, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word (10:44). It didn't matter if they were circumcised or not!

Of course, this was a scandal to those who had grown up with the traditions and the customs of circumcised believers. How is it that the Holy Spirit could call into their community those who had not been a part of the community from birth? Shouldn't there be some sort of test or requirement (circumcision or otherwise) that Gentiles should achieve before being baptized into the church? In many ways the church today is just as surprised by the power of the Holy Spirit inviting those to come be a part of the church who we would have otherwise not put on our invite list. We prefer to welcome people who are related to us in some

way through blood relation or marriage. One church I knew of in the Poconos treated evangelism as getting their kids and grandkids to come to church. They had no interest in the surrounding neighborhood that didn't look like them or talk like them. What's even worse is that they had names for "those people" who they felt didn't belong in their church. Whenever one of those people would visit their church, they were sure to whisper about them and ignore them. Surely God didn't want THOSE people in THEIR church.


We read throughout the New Testament of instances where the Holy Spirit seems to ignore OUR boundaries, rules, and expectations and instead extends the invitation of God to unlikely people: the poor, the blind, people with skin diseases, eunuchs, prostitutes and "even to Gentiles!" Through baptism the Holy Spirit calls us into this unusual and somewhat scandalous fellowship of Christ's disciples. Even we too are invited.

May this summer bring you to many new places and meet many new people! ~ Pr. Lee




Celebrate Diversity with Fun, Games and Food



The next choir practice will be after service on **Sunday, June 26th.** We will prepare a special hymn for July 10th.





Synod Assembly April 30, 2022



Here are highlights from the Assembly which our Council, Committees and congregation may find interesting and helpful.

General Info:

- It was the 34th Assembly
- It was held on ZOOM
- 341 people attended and 245 were registered voters
- 143 lay people attended
- 70,000 Lutherans are in SEPA
- Currently 42 Congregations in transition.
- Thanks were expressed for church's support of the Day of Service
- Offering (which included a QR code method) went to Ukraine via Lutheran Disaster Relief
- Keynote speaker was Pastor Nic Penaranda who spoke about African Descent Ministries

Voting:

- Several resolutions passed and seats were filled including:
- Jill Schott of St. Matthews, was elected to the Synod Consultation Committee.
- Affirmed SEPA's status as RIC (our synod has been in RIC since 1995)
- Support "due process" when a clergy member is being disciplined (came out of the Pacific conference I believe)
- Supported underserved urban ministries (note by the definition shared for population density per square mile Immanuel Norwood is considered urban)
- Fairer Pastor parental leave recommendation for when a new child comes into the family

<u>Items with direct interest to our committees/members:</u>

- Lutheran night at the Phillies is June 11
- New Augsburg fortress supplement "All Creation Sings" with 200 Hymns and Songs is coming out
- June 18th is the Synod workshop on Generosity at Trinity Lansdale
- Oct 11th is national coming out day
