#### PASTOR'S PEN

Most of us learned at an early age that if we make a mistake we are punished for it. We can become overcome by fear of making mistakes. There are many passages in scripture that talk about ways to handle our mistakes but here are two of my favorite.

**Isaiah 43:18-19**: "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.

**Philippians 3:13-14:** Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.



I started observing what it really means to learn from my mistakes. Consider learning to walk or ride a bike. If you fall, you get back up. The only consequence may be a few cuts and scrapes, maybe hurt pride. But each time you go a little further and you get a little better. You're given the space to fail and encouraged to keep trying.

### THANK YOU BOARD!!

The Resource Committee says "Thank You" to Immanuel!!!

Your support of our "Thank You Board" program has helped us raise money toward paying our 2 biggest Bills: Insurance & Heating Oil.

Last month's newsletter highlighted the Heating Oil for the coming winter, this time we will focus on:

### **INSURANCE FOR 2018-2019**

We have to pay our Insurance bills quarterly and now the cost of each bill has gone up to \$2630.00 per quarter, \$10,520 for the year.



There will be 100 envelopes put up each quarter with a goal to ideally get **\$25.00 per envelope** so we can pay our 4 insurance bills. You will see envelopes put up 4 times a year so we'll have **3 months** to fill envelopes for: DECEMBER, MARCH, JUNE, & SEPTEMBER.

### Every little bit helps, so do whatever you can!

Please take the envelope(s) you want off the board located in the Hospitality Area, donate what you can, write your envelope number on it and place them in the offering.

If you recall our "<u>OUCH</u>" communications, we had to liquidate some of our investments to pay the September bill since we had not gotten enough in through our regular giving. We can't afford to dip into our investments again so we really need everyone to try their best to help raise the monies needed so we can pay the December bill!!!

The cost per Poinsettia plant is \$8.00 each. Please use the envelope provided by the Altar Guild members for the completion of your order.




