PASTOR'S PEN

Our hymnal includes this beautiful prayer for grace to receive the word: "Blessed Lord God, you have caused the holy scriptures to be written for the nourishment of your people. Grant that we may hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that, comforted by your promises, we may embrace and forever hold fast to the hope of eternal life, which you have given us in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen."

One of the things I love about this prayer is the idea that the purpose of scripture is not just for our instruction or guidance. God has provided the scriptures to feed us, to nourish our spirits! Our Lutheran tradition is clear that we do not worship the Bible. We worship the triune God who is revealed through the words of scripture. Martin Luther compared the holy scriptures to a cradle that holds Christ, the living Word. The Bible is a complicated book (actually, a diverse collection of books). It can be perplexing, surprising, and occasionally, disturbing. But as a whole, it points us to Christ and invites us into a life-giving relationship with our living Savior and Lord.

I also love that image of "inwardly digesting" the Word. The implication here is that God wants us to be so immersed in scripture, so engaged with scripture, so involved with scripture, that it becomes part of us. The more we are fed by the Word, the more that Word shapes our prayers, our speech, and our imagination. It informs how we raise our children, and how we treat others.

I'm pretty sure that inward digestion is intended as a metaphor. However, there are two occasions in the Bible when someone (literally?) eats God's word. In the Hebrew Bible, the prophet Ezekiel has a vision in which God hands him a scroll and tells him to open up his mouth and



eat it. The scroll is covered with words of lamentation and woe. Yet, when Ezekiel eats it, it becomes sweet as honey in his mouth. (Ez. 2:8-3:3) In the book of Revelation, John is commanded to take and eat a little scroll from the hand of an angel. This scroll is also sweet going down, but becomes bitter in his belly. (Rev. 10:8-10).

These scenes are admittedly strange and mysterious. God can be like that! But is a command to eat a book really any more astonishing than the command to eat and drink the very body and blood of our Lord? "Very truly, I tell you...those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day...they abide in me,



and I in them." (John 6:53-56). The more we are fed, the closer we are united with the eternal and abundant life of Christ.

How are you nourished by God's living Word? What are the faith practices that help you to abide in the Word, so that it becomes integral to who you are and what you do? What encouragement and support do you need to "hear, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest" that Word more fully?

Happy September to All!

We hope you all had a nice, safe summer. Here we are already in the 9th month of 2021 and will be on the verge of the start of fall by the time you receive this!! We all hope and pray that the COVID vaccine distribution has continued to expand, that the Delta variant is getting under control, and more shots are getting into arms of those from Immanuel (and the Nation)!!

As we reported previously, we had received a "PPP" loan in 2020 for \$23,600.00 during the early phase of the pandemic. We have received from PNC their update on our standing with that PPP loan. Unfortunately we *do not* qualify for full forgiveness due to an overestimate when we filed, which PNC's poor support early in the process did not clarify. We *are eligible* for forgiveness of \$10,464. which we should count as a blessing. We will have to either repay the balance of \$13,136. or take all of it (or part of it) as a loan. Resource is working on options with Council to deal with this set back.

Your gifts to Immanuel (Time, Talents and Treasures) equip our Church to fulfill our mission even during these unique and challenging COVID times. We had seen variability in our regular offerings as 2021 and, unfortunately, some decline through the summer months. "Vacation time" is often more challenging to keep up with our giving. We ask that you do your best to "catch up" on your giving if indeed you find yourself behind. We ask all to prayerfully consider your support of Immanuel.



Let's do our best to provide <u>generous support</u> so we can continue our Mission doing God's Work, the best we can virtually for now (keep using Face Masks, Social distancing, washing of hands, following CDC guidelines and seek a vaccine if you have not already done so).


