# Pastor's Pen



### Dear friends in Christ,

We live in a time when political voices grow louder than the voice of the Gospel. Every election season, every national debate, every news headline seems to demand that we pick a side, pledge our loyalty, and defend it passionately. It's tempting — even comforting — to align ourselves with leaders who promise safety, prosperity, or moral renewal. But as followers of Jesus, we must be cautious. There is a deep spiritual danger in following political leaders more closely than we follow Christ.

Throughout Scripture, God's people were warned about misplaced allegiance. When Israel asked for a king "like the other nations," God's warning was clear: human power always tempts toward pride, injustice, and idolatry. Political leaders — even well-meaning ones — are not saviors. They cannot bear the weight of our hope, nor can they embody the fullness of God's justice and mercy.

Jesus never sought political power. He refused to be made king by the crowd, choosing instead the path of the cross. His kingdom is not of this world, yet it transforms this world through love, humility, and truth. When we follow Christ, our loyalty is not to a flag, a party, or a personality — it is to the crucified and risen Lord who calls us to love our enemies, seek peace, and serve the least among us.

This doesn't mean withdrawing from civic life. We are called to pray for our leaders, vote our conscience, and work for justice. But we must always do so as people shaped by the Gospel, not by partisan identity. Our highest allegiance is to the One who wore a crown of thorns, not a crown of power.

So, in this heated season, I invite you to pause. Spend more time in prayer than on punditry. Let Scripture guide your words more than social media. And remember: the kingdom of God will not arrive on any ballot, but in hearts transformed by grace.

  - #2. <u>Tithely</u> >>>>Consider using the safe, secure, easy virtual method with the QR code below with your smart phone. There are also buttons on our website and Facebook pages. Tithely can also set up a recurring, automatic monthly donation using one of your credit cards. There is a nominal fee with this.

Santa and his back drop of a toy train display and tree will be available for families to take their own pictures, from 11AM – 12 PM at the Christmas Bazaar.


