Pastor's Pen

Lent emerged shortly following the Council of Nicea in 325 AD. Council records suggest that the fast applied at first mainly to new converts as a period of repentance and reflection before baptism at Easter. Lent is a time in the Christian calendar which moves us from the light of Epiphany to the darkness of introspection focusing on: Temptation: Consider how Christ spent 40 days in the wilderness fasting and praying before beginning his public ministry.

- Prayer: Consider how prayer reconnects us to God.
- Fasting: Consider how fasting reminds of us of God's presence.
- Almsgiving: Consider how almsgiving is reminder of God's generosity.
- Repentance: Consider how repentance is a theme of Lent.
- Contemplation: Consider how contemplation helps to renew our mind toward God.
- O Relationship with God: Consider how themes of Lent relate to our relationship with God, such as lamenting, waiting, humility, and forgiveness. Lent is also a time of action to strengthen our spiritual bond to God, ourselves and the whole of creation. Most people wait until they are certain before they act. But you will never be certain of anything until you act.

Karl's Story of where I've seen GOD at Work in My Life. March 10, 2025


My name is Karl McClellan and I'm a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Norwood, Pa. I'd like to share a story of where I've seen God at work in my life. My best friend passed away last year after a long illness. We met in college, we were each other's best man when we married, shared similar hobbies, we were Godfathers to each other's first born and for nearly 45 years absolutely the best of friends. He came down with a terminal disease and in the last stages he was placed in hospice at his home. I visited often though it was some of the hardest times I ever had to spend seeing him withering away. I did all I could to be there for my best friend and his family. As the end was nearing and his condition worsened, we were all praying for the Lord to take him home and to give us strength to somehow get through and be there for him...and each other. Thankfully, we all knew he had strong faith and that he knew eventually his Lord would take him home.

One day leaving his house while driving, a song came on the radio by Carrie Underwood that I believe was sent in that moment by God to comfort me and help us through this. The song is called "Our Temporary Home" and the last verse goes something like this "Old man.... hospital bedthe room is filled with people he loves, and he whispers "don't cry for me I'll see you all someday.... he looks up and says...... I can see God's face" This is my temporary home, it's not where I belong, windows in rooms that I'm passing through...... this was just a stop, on the way to where I'm going...... I'm not afraid because I know......... this was my temporary home."

I had to pull over as I listened to this and wept. I shared that story with his wife later that same day and somehow, knowing that he was at peace and ready to go see his maker, made the final weeks something we could all get through. I believe this is an example of God being there in our lives to help us through some of our darkest times. Knowing that my best friend is with his Lord looking down on us...and that someday we will all be together again...... gives me peace.



I have been blessed to be part of Immanual's family my whole life. One of the key things that I have learned over that time is the importance and the power of prayer. This experience with my best friend's passing was a powerful reminder of how important it is that we do pray and establish a relationship with our Lord. In his time and in his way, I do believe that answers to our prayers do



come. Thank you for allowing me to share my story. We'd love to have you come join us at Immanuel, and see how God is at work, in all our lives


Easter Egg Hunt
