Pastor's Pen

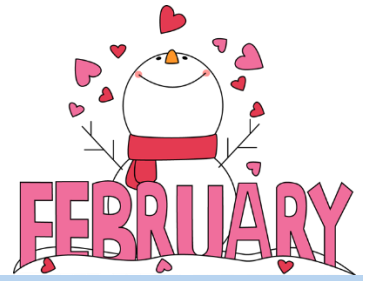
Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season that invites us to slow down and tell the truth about who we are and whose we are. As ashes are placed on our foreheads, we hear the ancient words: *"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."* These words are not meant to shame us, but to ground us in humility and honesty before God. They remind us that life is fragile, time is precious, and grace is essential.

Lent is often described as a season of repentance, but repentance is more than feeling sorry—it is a turning. A turning back toward God when we have wandered, a turning toward our neighbor when we have been self-focused, and a turning inward to face the places in our lives that need healing. Through prayer, worship, fasting, generosity, and acts of love, Lent creates space for God to work in us, not by our effort alone, but by God's mercy.

This Lenten journey leads us to the cross and ultimately to the empty tomb. Along the way, we walk with Jesus through wilderness and suffering, trusting that God is still at work bringing life out of death. May this season be a time of honest reflection, deepened faith, and renewed hope as we prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter.

Severe Weather Policy

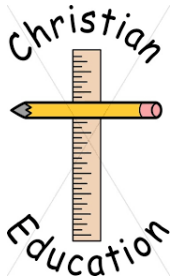

For example, Wells Fargo will help you set this up **at no cost to you!** Contact your bank and they can help you set it up.
 - #2. **Tithely** >>>>Consider using the safe, secure, easy virtual method with the QR code below with your smart phone. There are also buttons on our website and Facebook pages. Tithely can also set up a recurring, automatic monthly donation using one of your credit cards. There is a nominal fee with this.



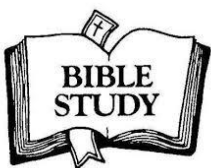
Looking forward in 2026.....

- ❖ The Property Committee is leading the effort to get a plan to repair our Air Conditioning system. We'll share the full plan that once it is figured out. If you would like to contribute toward this, please put your donation in an envelope, just write **AC** + your envelope number on the outside and place it in the offering plate.
- ❖ We are in the peak of the 2026 Heating Oil season. Our cost is \$1300./month plus the Maintenance contract. Our VBS mascot **Scout** is heading up our heating oil campaign board...stop by...say hello...and if you can, take an envelope to help with this cost.
- ❖ All our committees plan to have a month to share with you what we do. For Resource (we used to be called the Finance Committee), we: take care of the business side of our church, receive income, pay the bills, monitor our "BIG Spends" looking for ways to reduce costs for things like Insurance and Utilities, develop the annual budget, conduct a yearly audit, coordinate with our tellers who count the offering and with all other committees who raise or spend money. We meet once a month on the 2nd Tuesday. If you have questions or would like to consider being on our committee, please see us!

Save TAX DOLLARS and; Contribute to your Church with a “QCD”!

How? Make a Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD) With a QCD, the distributions are tax-free if they are paid directly from the IRA to an eligible charitable organization, thereby preserving more of your principle!

To be eligible you must: ? Be at least 70 ½ years old.

Have an IRA that contains “qualified funds” which means they were not taxed when the contributions to the IRA were made.

Make the donation to the church directly by the IRA’s trustee and not by the IRA’s owner.

Another nice feature for those who are at least 73 years old, QCDs count toward the IRA owner and 39;s required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year.

Want more information? Contact your investment advisor or your IRA’s trustee. An added resource if you choose to consider this, is our church’s Financial Advisor, Justin Creighton who is with Kuttin Wealth

Tindall Family visits Immanuel to see the Mural and Trace their Family Tree

In early December, I received a call from Suzanne Tindall Crump, a distant relative of Miriam Tindall who painted the mural that graces the rear wall in our sanctuary. Her family has been working on tracing their family tree, was aware of the mural, some of the history of the original artist and asked if they could possibly come to visit during the Christmas holiday as several members of their family from out of state would be in the area. I set up a visit and provided them with several documents from our 80th celebration of the mural, which we held back in 2019.

Six members of their family came on December 26th (in the picture, from left to right are: Sitka Crump (from Los Angeles, Al & Suzzane Crump from Reading, Gage and Anza Crump also from Los Angeles). They had a chance to see the mural, gather some more family history and enjoy some time in our church! For those who may not know, here is a little bit of the history of our mural:

- Painted by Miriam Tindall Smith (1901-1984), who was born in Norwood, in memory of her mother, Jennie Minerva Tindall over a period of 2 years.
- Miriam Tindall Smith was a renowned artist, member of the Philadelphia Art Alliance who had major works exhibited in Art Institute of Chicago, Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, and the 1939 New York's World Fair to name a few.

Suzanne and I are going to stay in touch to share whatever else they learn about the artist and to see if we can confirm that Miriam and her mother were officially members of Immanuel back in the 1930's.



I encourage you to take a moment to look up and enjoy, once again this beautiful mural.
