

Gratitude Month: What Is It and Why Do We Have It

Historically "Gratitude Month" dates back to the 1940s, when first the Alcoholic Foundation and later the General Service Board would host a Gratitude luncheon, which over the years has become a dinner and has grown considerably in participation.

Many Areas and/or Intergroups/Central Offices throughout the Conference would host these Dinners in gratitude for Sobriety and the gifts brought them through practicing the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Over time these Gratitude Dinners during the month of November have become "Self-Support Functions" to ensure that A.A. services at the Area, District and local level maintain sufficient funds to finance such services.

Self-Support starts with the Seventh Tradition at group level; Since the Intergroups and Central Offices are created by these groups, they depend very heavily on the generosity of the groups to continue the services as required and or requested or mandated by the groups. So, in the spirit of self-support rather then relying on outside Fund Raisers, starting with the original Gratitude luncheons in the 1940s "Self-Support Functions" have become a standard practice at all levels of service.

Another method of practicing "Self Support" is the Birthday Contribution practiced both by A.A. World Services as well as most local Intergroups and Central Offices, where celebrants contribute a set amount for each year of their sobriety.

Locally District 6 hosts four annual Self-Support functions—The Annual Gratitude Dinner held during November in Indian River County; a Spaghetti Dinner in Martin County usually February or early March; a Founders Day Luncheon in St. Lucie County on or near June 10th of each year; and a Fish Fry in Okeechobee County during August or September. The Indian River Central Office hosts an annual Self -Support function through the Birthday Dinner usually in the month of March

The Contributions and Self-Support A.A.'s Seventh Tradition principles state: **"Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."** This means that only A.A. members contribute financially to A.A. – and even A.A. members are limited in the amount they can contribute.

Dr. Bob, one of our co-founders passed away November 16, 1950 In his memory below is his last message to A.A. presented at the first International AA Convention held in Cleveland OH in July 1950.

"My good friends in A.A. and of A.A., I feel I would be very remiss if I didn't take this opportunity to welcome you here to Cleveland, not only to this meeting but those that have already transpired. I hope very much that the presence of so many people and the words that you have heard will prove an inspiration to you -- not only to you, but may you be able to impart that inspiration to the boys and girls back home who were not fortunate enough to be able to come. In other words, we hope that your visit here has been both enjoyable and profitable.

"I get a big thrill out of looking over a vast sea of faces like this with a feeling that possibly some small thing I did a number of years ago played an infinitely small part in making this meeting possible. I also get quite a thrill when I think that we all had the same problem. We all did the same things. We all get the same results in proportion to our zeal and enthusiasm and stick-to-itiveness.

"If you will pardon the injection of a personal note at this time, let me say that I have been in bed five of the last seven months, and my strength hasn't returned as I would like, so my remarks of necessity will be very brief

"There are two or three things that flashed into my mind on which it would be fitting to lay a little emphasis. One is the simplicity of our program. Let's not louse it all up with Freudian complexes and things that are interesting to the scientific mind but have very little to do with our actual A.A. work. Our Twelve Steps, when immersed down to the last, resolve themselves into the words 'love' and 'service.' We understand what love is, and we understand what service is. So let's bear those two things in mind.

"Let us also remember to guard that erring member the tongue, and if we must use it, let's use it with kindness and consideration and tolerance.

"And one more thing: None of us would be here today if somebody hadn't taken time to explain things to us, to give us a little pat on the back, to take us to a meeting or two, to do numerous little kind and thoughtful acts in our behalf So let us never get such a degree of smug complacency that we're not willing to extend, or attempt to extend, to our less fortunate brothers that help which has been so beneficial to us. Thank you very much."
