Sundowners

Sundowners began as an offshoot of The Breakthrough Meeting held at Sebastian Executive Building. The meeting was very crowded and some felt the message was getting lost. At a Celebration of Life service, held at United Church of Sebastian, Pastor Tim offered a meeting room to Pat and Amy for one dollar per meeting. Pat and Amy were joined by Lois, Mikki, Sue W., Priscilla, and Debra, forming Sundowners in 2006. The group officially registered January 2007 and given #85224.

Sundowners began with five meetings per week and quickly grew to seven meetings. Every day at 5:00 pm. The meetings were all open consisting of six book and one discussion. The group steadily grew for thirteen years.

In 2019 United Church of Sebastian merged with Calvary Chapel of Sebastian. In 2020 Sundowners were asked to leave. Covid-19 hit at the same time. In-person meetings were non-existent. Sundowners was in limbo. Some members started Sundowners meetings on Zoom while others found outdoor meetings in parks. The group did start Zoom meetings. During this time, Vicki and Fireman John, developed a relationship with First Presbyterian Church of Sebastian and began holding in-person meetings outside, under the church porte-cochere. Once able, First Presbyterian Church of Sebastian welcomed us inside, where we currently meet at 5:00 pm everyday. We have the same format one discussion and six book meetings, all open. Sundowners is committed to the three AA legacies: recovery, service and unity. The group is very active in service, with a Central Office Rep, Treatment, Central Office Birthday Dinner, Speaker Exchange, Alkathon, Unity and Founders Day Celebration. We carry the message of recovery.

The Twelve Concepts for World Service

How Bill W. explained the spiritual principles that undergird A.A.'s structure and how the parts work together.

This is a pamphlet about the Concepts; it is NOT the Concepts themselves. They are found in the book The A.A. Service Manual/Twelve Concepts for World Service, and should be read by every "trusted servant."

As A.A. grow up, it began with the groups — first
only a few, then hundreds and then thousands. Very
early an Alcoholic Foundation, later renamed The
General Service Board, was formed to be responsible for
our affairs. And with Dr. Bob's death and Bill's facing our annex. And with DF, 1900 s death and pairs taking up to his own mortality, a General Service Conference assumed the leadership which had fallen to the co-founders. Meanwhile, a finy publishing operation sail service office had grown in size and importance to the. Fellowship, and a monthly journal, the AA Grapevine, was being published.

Which of these entities was supposed to do what? Little wonder there was confusion? What was their relationship? Who was in charge? What were their respon





subilities — and what were their rights Bill W, himself was sometimes part of the pulling and hauling that took place, and so he saw the need to "reduce to writing" his concepts of the "why" of the whole structure, the lesson the drawn from experience, the relationships and, above all, the spiritual principles.

As Bill set them down, the Twelve Concepts are a potpourri. Concepts III through V, IX and XII deal with spiritual principles; the remainder, though they have spiritual overciones, are devoted to describing the relationship of the various service entities and how they work together.




