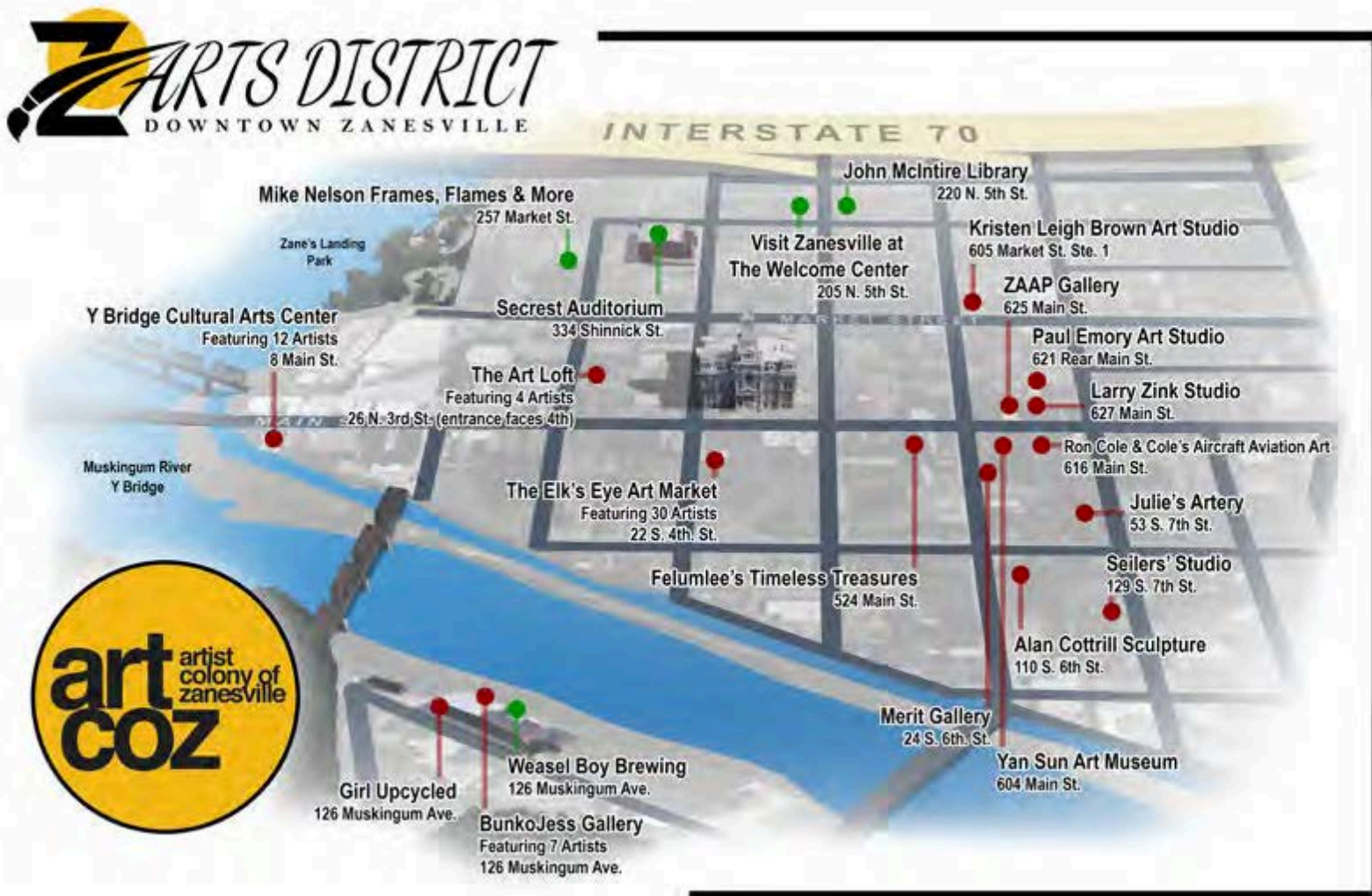

ArtCoz is pleased to present Allison Weeks as our November Featured Artist. Known for her expressive brushwork and storytelling style, Allison's work ranges from pet and people portraits, to landscapes and still life's. She recently worked on a lighthearted "Red Chair" series, where pets relax with a glass of bourbon and a cigar.



Her latest collection focuses on bourbon-themed still lifes, featuring bottles like Buffalo Trace, Weller, Maker's Mark, and Old Forester. Each piece reflects her appreciation for rich color, texture, and mood—inviting viewers to slow down and savor the moment.

Allison balances her creative life with her professional role as Vice President of Engagement, Development & Brand Experience at North Valley Bank, and she is an active supporter of the arts in our community currently serving as vice president of ArtCoz and as a director of the Muskingum County Arts Council.

The Art Loft featuring Emily Kellett

Emily Kellett is a multidisciplinary artist and designer inspired by the natural world. This show features her handwoven pieces accompanied by a selection of graphite and ink drawings.

With a background in Industrial Design, she is used to thinking and creating in three dimensions, which is what first drew her to handweaving. Diving into the world of weaving just over a year ago, she continues to be fascinated by the loom and the process it enables, transforming individual strands of yarn into beautiful, intricate fabrics.

Her woven work features wall hangings, scarves, and towels crafted from natural fibers, including wool, silk, linen, and cotton. She appreciates the duality of the weaving process. The first half of the process is technical and mentally demanding, from choosing a new pattern and calculating yardage to threading hundreds of tiny strings through the loom. In contrast, the second half is meditative and allows for moments of peace. She finds joy in the mystery that exists between time spent warping the loom and seeing the final piece revealed when it's taken off the loom.

Through her work, Emily invites viewers to slow down and notice the beauty in process, material, and time.

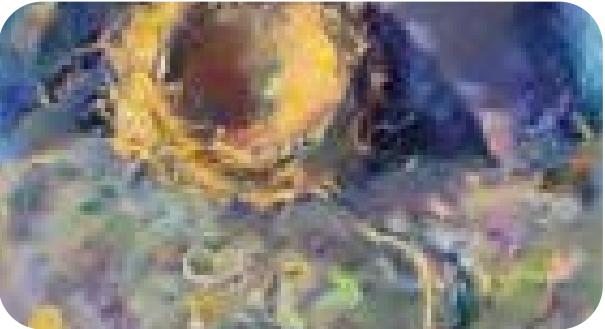
Our artist of the month is Nora Daniel:

Nora V Daniel delights in paying homage to nature through expressive brush work and impasto, occasionally tightening up for a detail. Nora's revived friendship with Mary Giammarino has encouraged more freedom and spontaneity in the landscapes and interiors which delight the senses while conveying time of day, season and mood.

Lively dialogue is encouraged between art and viewer, through sufficient ambiguity, imagination and interpretation are fostered.

The paintings that make up this show are all locally produced, many of which are Coopermill clotheslines and chickens.

Nora has been collected and shown widely in Columbus as well as NYC where she was born, raised, studied and taught before moving to Ohio in 2005. Throughout her life, Nora has done residencies in Venice Italy, Havana, Cuba and Hamburg Germany. She teaches privately as well as at the Columbus College of Art.
