



# **Hotspot Service Has Ended**



We have received word from the director at the Greenville Library that the hotspot service program has ended. I have included message from her giving you some more information. Please read below.

"I had hoped to be able to give you more warning, but the hotspot service provided through the library will end today, February 20. I'm sorry for the inconvenience I'm sure this will cause.


I reached out to T-Mobile last week to try to see when our service would be good through and found out today that the service billing goes through the 20th... today. Since the service was through the Emergency Connectivity Fund, which only funded us for a 12-month period, we cannot continue longer with this.

If you'd like to continue using your T-Mobile hotspot, you can take the hotspot to a T-Mobile store and get a new SIM card. According to a quick search, the closest store would be next to the Walmart in Hermitage (1037 N Hermitage Rd, Hermitage, PA 16148). This would require you to pay for a monthly service (and possible for the SIM card (\$10). I am looking into other options that may be lower cost through the library, but do not have anything set up at this time. If I find other options, I will be sure to reach out to you."


This lively interactive Easter story takes readers to a construction site where all the trucks discover signs of spring as the snow melts. Illustrations.

by Jodi Dee



by Kristin Hannah



### The fury


