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
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Editor's Notes



Between the Cones

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i everyone, with summer starting and more people wanting to

participate in our monthly Autocross, I thought that it would be a good time to remind everyone of the rules. I know that we are here to have some fun and enjoy our cars but, if we mistreat the track, then we open up the possibility that the Sheriff's Office would quit letting us use their track. We need to always keep in mind that they are letting us use the track. We could lose this privilege if we fail to be responsible and take care of this track. If we lost this privilege then we would be forced to either give up the Autocross events or find a parking lot to have our events and neither one of these options would be any fun. That is one of the reasons why a group of us that use the track sat down and came up with some basic rules that would make the event safe and protect the cars and track. From time to time the rules have been altered or expanded as needed to keep them current.

Below are some of the rules that we have set up for a safe time at the track. From these rules we have made copies for everyone to look at. Everyone is welcome to read or look over the rules at anytime and ask questions if they do not understand any of the rules. We

want to make sure that everyone understands and follows all of the rules at the Autocross events.

Here is a list of the rules:

- 1) All Participants, Workers, and Spectators must read these rules and then read and sign the release/waiver to gain access to the event. The reason is to protect both you and the club in case something goes wrong.
- 2) No one (drivers, spectators, or workers) may consume, possess, or be under the influence of drugs or alcoholic beverages prior to or during the event. Anyone suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol during a driving event will be told to leave the premises.
- 3) Participants must be 16 or older and hold a valid driver's license to drive in the event. If under 18, must have a signed parent consent from both parents/guardian and at least one parent/guardian must be present at the event, and that parent/guardian must be a PCA member.

- 4) No one (driver or passenger) is permitted to drive on the course without wearing an approved helmet (Snell 95 or later) and seat belt. We have a few loaner helmets available on request.
- 5) No passengers are allowed during timed runs, the only exception being instructors approved by the event chairman. An un-timed fun run period will be available after all timed sessions have concluded where registered drivers are allowed to take passengers. Fun run availability is subject to the chairman's discretion.
- 6) Participants are expected to arrive and register no later than 45 minutes after the advertised registration start time. If you arrive later than 45 minutes, you will not be allowed to drive in the event. This is up to the discretion of the event chairman.
- 7) The number of participants is limited to 40. Registration of non-members will hold at 35 registrants to allow room for PCA members. Once registration ends the waiting non-members will be registered first come first served up to 40.
- 8) All vehicles must pass a technical inspection before driving the course. To pass the technical inspection, the car must meet the following criteria:
- Must be in good working order with no major fluid leaks.
- Must have a working muffler.
- Must have working seat belts or harness.

- Battery must be firmly held in place.
- Tires must meet a minimum tread depth as indicated by wear bars with no cords showing.
- No loose items in car.
- At least one lug per wheel checked for proper torque. Which is 95 ftlbs.
- 9) Cars will be classed by tire type on inspection, either Competition or Street. Anything with a tread wear rating under 180 is considered Competition.
- 10) Four wheels off the pavement into the grass twice, and you are retired for the remainder of the event without a refund.
- 11) If your driving is deemed unsafe by the event chair, you will be warned once then retired without a refund for the full cost of repair or replacement.
- 12) If you damage club, Sheriff's department, or another participant's property or equipment, you are responsible for full cost of repair or replacement.
- 13) All driving participants to serve as a course worker during the sessions they do not drive in. Failure to work will mean an additional \$20 fee assessed before you can register for another event.

Even with all of these rules and regulations they are subject to change as the need arises on the day of the event by the event chairman to keep everyone safe.

hat the treasury continues in sound shape is still the truth. I am happy that I never had to come up with an opening line for this column that is different.

We have not yet had the opportunity to make the charitable donation to the Sunbeam Family Service for 2012 for the car show. Sunbeam is the charity the board of directors has decided to support as the club charity. Every single year when we do the planning for the Pow-Wow, we discuss which charity to support. The charity is the main reason for the car show. We have never made any significant profit from the Pow-Wow car show. The autocross is the main money maker for the club.

For many years when the War Whoop was printed for free and expenses were low, we accumulated cash to just silly levels. The board saw no legitimate reason to continue to have a huge bank balance. We are incorporated as a non-profit educational club.

We talked to the Sheriff himself and asked where the money we made from the autocross could be donated. At that time, Ken Johnson was the president of the club and the entire board decided to donate money to Sunbeam Family Services. Every year we discuss it again. Every year it has been voted on

We are not stuck giving to one charity or any fixed amount. This year will be the smallest donation in many years. The board for 2012 decided to continue the car show, and the donation. For the 2012 car show, the donation will be just \$1,000. We have donated over \$5,000 in one year. In the last 10 years we have donated over \$17,000 to numerous charities from the Salvation Army to the suicide prevention hotline and of course Sunbeam Family Services.


The board would like your input. If you have suggestions and can help in any way please feel free to attend a board meeting. If you don't want to attend you can contact a board member and give them your suggestions.




The meeting then ended for another evening.
