


Tech Tip-911 Owners

Subject: Chain Sprocket Support Part Identifier 15 28

Modifications during 1980 model year: (as of Engine No. 930/07 640 0451)



15-A026

- chain sprocket supports have wider bearing (1) and additional bushing (2)
- upper mounting boss (3) on chain tensioner has been narrowed
- upper mounting shaft (4) in chain housing is now polished

Key Points:

- Has widened bearings and additional bushing
- Can be retrofitted

Retrofitting earlier cars

New parts can be installed in earlier cars as follows:

- install chain tensioner, Part No. 930 105 053 00, and sprocket support, Part No. 930 105 509 00/ 510 00, together. (Previous chain tensioner, Part No. 930 105 049 00, cannot be used with new sprocket support or vice versa)
- use either new or old chain housing; however, when installing new sprocket support into old chain housing, Part No. 930 105 061 00/062 00, upper chain tensioner support shaft in housing must be polished with a fine polishing cloth

Both new and old parts are available as replacement parts








PORSCHE 928

Porsche's top-line model, the 928, boasts new fuel economy figures of 24 miles per gallon on the highway and 15 mpg around town for the five-speed version. Gas mileage is impressive in light of the fact that the 928 accelerates from 0 to 60 miles-per-hour in about seven seconds and has a top speed of nearly 140 mph. 

German Dinner





FROM THE WIZARD

Did you know ...

HORSEPOWER is the work required to lift 33,000 pounds, one foot in one minute. The difference between the SAE (gross) and DIN ratings is that the SAE test has no power robbing auxilliary equipment (i.e., alternator, water pump, fan, belt, etc.) During testing the ignition and cooling are supplied from external sources. The DIN rating is rated in an as installed condition.

VOX CAELESTIS - There is a sustained tone in many of Johann Sebastion Bach's fugues called a vox caelestis. It is a tone produced by an organ stop which opens two sets of pipes, one of which plays just slightly sharper than the other, giving a wavy, tremulous tone.

The racing success of Porsche has produced many such vox caelestis tones at any given race. Two Porsches alongside with identical gear ratios will sometimes produce vox caelestis tones.

PS - Vox Caelestis means CELESTIAL VOICES.



924 owners who don't want their headlights up while the parking lights are on can solve the problem with the following modification:


- 1. Remove the light switch by squeezing the plastic retainers from the backside of the dashboard.
- Cut the small solid grey wire as close to the switch as possible.
- 3. Tie the small solid grey wire into the heavy white with black line wire.







Both routes provided a beautiful display of fall colors and some really exciting roads. Dinner and accomoda-


