n my first newsletter article I wrote about Porsche being a cut above. That was on display during the recent Porsche Club of America Parade event in French Lick Indiana. What a nice place. I did not attend the Parade event at this venue a few years ago. Now I know why they came back.

You're not going to run across this place by accident. It's 40 miles from the interstate and about 100 miles from an airport. The farm land in this part of Indiana is grade A and the crops look

like they should be pictured in an agricultural text book. The French Lick hotel was an older style with a big front porch including an old style dixieland band playing to welcome the Porsche crowd. The interior was ornate and very nice. It looked like something out of The Great Gatsby. Upon trying to check in I found my room was ready





but at the other hotel. The other hotel was a about two miles away and turn this way and turn and turn. I was less than pleased thinking I got the Motel 6 version. I could not have been more wrong. The other hotel was the West Baden Springs hotel. It's actually in an adjoining town. It looks like a slightly smaller version of the Astrodome with six stories of rooms on the outside and a very nice lobby area in the middle.

The building and grounds are a story in and of themselves. Initially built in the early 1900's it included a 2/3 mile bicycle track along with a spa and the five star attractions of the day. It was donated to the Army during WWI for use as a hospital. After the war it was back in business and times were booming until the stock market crash. The property was eventually sold to the Jesuits for one dollar. Some accouterments were sold away and it was used as a school until maintenance became too much. The property went downhill until the Cook family got involved. In a joint venture with the State they invested over \$ 500 million dollars in the restoration. It reopened in 2006. Guests, state conferences and a casino keep the place going.

PCA put together several excursions to various local attractions. I took a tour of the Dallara Indy car Factory in Indianapolis. PCA had the tours reserved for the club members and included a catered lunch. The Indy racecar is virtually all various types of carbon fiber and can be yours for about \$ 700,000.00, plus motor. That makes a Porsche Turbo S look like a deal.

With a car show, tours, dinners, rallies,





hospitality, art show, kids program, eracing area and Porsche factory display there is something for everyone. The event is well attended and not everything went perfectly but all in all PCA has to get a grade of A for putting on a first class event. Next years Parade is in the Poconos. Hmmm.

As far as the trip goes my 82 911 SC did well with a 26 MPG average over 1800 plus miles on primarily E 10 fuel. The AC has been improved but still a work in progress. 
Steve Pistole discussed giving a gift to each couple who came to the Christmas party. A DVD copy of the movie LeMan was discussed as an option.

The War Bonnet Gourmet

Skillet Balsamic Chicken Breasts

Ingredients

1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil

4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, pounded to 1-inch thickness

salt and fresh ground pepper, to taste

2 tablespoons butter, divided

1 small yellow onion, diced

3 cloves garlic, minced

1/2 teaspoon Italian seasoning

1 teaspoon granulated sugar

2 teaspoons balsamic vinegar

1/2 cup chicken broth

1/2 cup heavy cream

chopped fresh basil or parsley, for garnish

Instructions

1. Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat.

2. Pound chicken breasts down to 1inch thickness; season chicken with salt and pepper; add to the heated oil and cook for 5 minutes, undisturbed.

3. Flip chicken breasts over; add 1 tablespoon butter and continue to cook for 4 to 5 more minutes, or until cooked through. Internal temperature should register at 165?F.

4. Remove chicken breasts from skillet and set aside; keep them covered.

5. Add remaining butter to the skillet.

6. Stir in diced onions and cook for about 6 to 8 minutes, or until very soft. Stir frequently. If they start to burn, lower the heat.

7. Stir in the garlic and cook for 20 seconds.

8. Stir in Italian seasoning, sugar, and balsamic vinegar; cook for 2 minutes.

9. Whisk in the chicken broth; continue to whisk and scrape up all the browned bits from the bottom of the skillet.

10. Increase the heat to High and cook for about 2 to 3 minutes, or until the liquid has reduced a bit.

11. Lower heat to medium and whisk in the cream; whisk continually for about 30 seconds so that the sauce doesn't start to boil.

12. Let sauce come to a simmer; add the chicken breasts back to the skillet. Cook for 1 to 2 minutes, or just until chicken is heated through.

13. Remove from heat. Sauce will thicken as it stands.

14. Garnish with basil and serve.
