Glen Hoskins and I had the privilege of visiting Sunbeam last week and presenting the club donation. It was definitely appreciated in these tough economic times.





One hand on the wheel and all this cold


steel, feels heavy and too much to bear. But the engine turns over, look over my shoulder.

Upon this utterly fine Porsche day.





# **Treasurer's Tid-Bits**

he War Bonnet Region of PCA is incorporated as a non-profit educational organization. We do not pay any income taxes, but we do have to file an income tax form each year. Fortunately, Mike Savuto is a board member and a CPA. He has been kind enough to fill out the tax forms and keep us in good graces with the IRS & the Oklahoma Tax commission. One would think a tax form for a little non-profit educational club would be simple. All the numbers are zero, but it is an IRS form. I gave up last year and asked Mike Savuto to help. He files the club taxes and does not charge the club at all.

The club has several sources of income, the biggest of which is the autocross. We have a monthly autocross all year long. In the last 12 months the autocross has provided over four thousand dollars of profit. The War Whoop is the biggest expense of the club. The printing and postage of the War Whoop is the only regular expense we have.

Even after all of the expenses are added together, we make a profit each year. That is of course a very good thing. There is just no logical reason to build savings past our current level. All the board members receive the same salary

from the club that you receive as a member, which is of course zero. So what do we do with the extra money the club brings in? We give it to charity. The board of directors decide how much and which charity we should support. November 19th, 2009, we gave a check for \$2,000.00 to Sunbeam Family Services. Louis Lackey was forced to stand next to Kelli Dupuy for several photos. He did not seem to mind that job. Check out the article from Louis for more information about the donation.

That recent donation got me to wondering just how much our little club has donated to charity in recent years. Since the Tulsa group split from War Bonnet Region in the late 80's, our region has never had more than two hundred members. We have been as small as 115 members and as of this month, we are at 159 members.

I did a quick search of the club checkbook and only looked back to August of 2003. I was amazed to discover the total. In just six short years we have made donations to five different charities, to the tune of \$18,750 dollars! These are charities like Sunbeam Family Services, The Salvation Army, EARC in Edmond, The HOPE Center, and the CARE center of Oklahoma City. Our little club has made a difference for several charities.

I want to personally welcome one new member to our club. He is the youngest board member we have ever had. He has attended most of the club events since he joined the club at the tender age of 18. He has helped at the Charity Car Show and is always willing to help where ever needed. He is an Eagle Scout and currently attending college in Weatherford. Welcome Sidney Johnson. We will find a lot of work for you in War Bonnet Region. No paycheck, just lots of work and fun.

So what does Rick do with his time now?

Rick told me he also makes his real living doing custom tile work and believe me, he is your man when you might want a bathroom or kitchen redone as the pictures I've seen are beautiful. He is as crafty with tile as he is his words. Now lets how his Porsche history has formed.

It was only 2001 when he first joined the PCA with a 1982 silver 930 turbo he bought in 1986. His present car was purchased from Ebay. He told me the story of how he and his girlfriend, Shelley, drove to St. Louis, Missouri to pick up his 996 twin turbo.

You know he had to stretch it's legs a bit on the return trip home so he continued to tell me how much fun it was to play catch-up with Shelley since she had a pike-pass and he didn't. In fact, during one of the spirited runs, a tricked-out Lexus tried to give Rick a run for his money. They went into triple digits a few times. The Lexus must have had a good radar detector as they both slowed when speeding towards a hill. You guessed it! A patrol officer was on the other side and



pointed at Rick to slow down. Rick showed that cop all the brake lights he had even though he was still doing 90 mph. He let him go.

When asked about the modifications he has done, Rick explained, "I've made many mods to the car since I purchased it in 2007. The body has a GT 2 body kit with assorted carbon fiber pieces. The suspension has H&R lowering springs, 3 piece HRE 542R 19" wheels and an adjustable factory Porsche GT 3 rear sway bar that helps take most of the push out. The interior has a Porsche Tequipment roll bar, GT 3 seats and arctic silver consoles steering wheel and trim. The interior also has speed yellow seat belts, gauge faces and stitching with alcantera inserts in the seats.

The engine is putting out about 625hp at the crank. The turbo's are K24 hybrids with 18g wheels and 1 bar wastegates. The engine breathes through a Fabspeed airbox & exhaust and larger intercoolers with high boost hoses. The badly needed fuel is handled by a 5 bar fuel pressure regulator and everything is supported with a Protomotive tune on the ECU. This car ROCKS!"

So the next time you see Rick Eager, ask him for a ride in that rocket. If you've never seen it, it is beautifully done and worthy of the People's Choice Award which was given to him at our car show hosted by Sonic.

Thank you, Rick, for the great story... now you owe me a drive!
