








President's Podium

Treasurer's Tid-Bits

e have had great income in the last few weeks. PCA national doled out an extra distribution this quarter. We had the car show income and the biggest deposit was from the November autocross. We had an overwhelming turnout for the autocross and the new rates of \$30 for non-member and \$20 for members brought in over \$1,300. Not bad for one very long day of work.

Don't think for a second that hard work was all my effort. I was just a very small part of the effort. Matt Herndon & Louis Lackey did the major part, with a lot of help from the Goodman brothers, Chad & Randall.

At the last board meeting we decided to give the Sunbeam Family Charity \$2,000 this year. We will present that check soon. The club pays \$20 per meal for the cost of the Christmas party meal. That helps keep the cost to a very affordable level for each member. With all those expenses and deposits, we will remain in sound financial condition at the end of the year.

One of the issues I want to discuss is a way for the club finances to be monitored by more eyes than just the treasurer. Right now that is me, and I have 100% confidence the club's assets are well managed. I send a bank report to the President each month.

Computers have changed all of that. Currently I use Quickbooks 2010 and planning on upgrading to the newer version soon. Mike Savuto is a long time member, a CPA and a friend of the club and someone we can trust. He files our club tax forms and helps me with the club's books when I get stumped. I asked his advice on how the club can monitor the finances with more than just the treasurer. He suggested we move the club Quickbooks account to the on-line version. With that system we can provide a password to the President, Vice President and whatever persons the board deems should have access.

Nothing will happen without full board approval but I want to move the club financial management to a secure on-line method. With the proper passwords and access level, some board members will be able to see the actual bank statements and just the proper officers can make changes.




