



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
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# Between the Cones

ike the first warm days of Spring and the first openwindow nights of sleep, I

look forward to my issue of The War Whoop with equal hope and joyfulness as the arrival of Excellence. As I have been thinking of ways to make this publication more entertaining for you, I have decided to include a centerfold! Okay, so I am kidding but how about some real racing news.

My favorite driver, Patrick Long (USA) and his teammate Jorg Bergmeister (Germany) won their latest American Le Mans Series race at Miller Motorsports Park in the Flying Lizard GT2 Porsche. This puts them in a solid 1st place points total stance ahead of the Ferrari drivers Salo and Melo half way through the series. This makes me particularly happy since I replay the Ferrari event shortcutting the last turn and running over the race-leading Porsche from a few years ago.

Although the fight for sports car domination has never been won, only continued to every next year, I do feel a new era of drivers is here. The pairing of Long and Bergmeister is resulting in more and more podium finishes. The Risi owned Ferrari team of Melo/ Salo could take first place every time they enter the field. And someone else from

the Ferrari stable, Dominik Farnbacher is driving his F430 GTC to third in points this year after being on the bottom of the grids just 4 years ago. As such a competitor and having this dear loyalty in my heart for Porsche, I sincerely feel the pressure mounting against the Porsche team. But then I remember, Long was way back at 13th position in points a few years ago, ahead of names like JimTafel and Marc Lieb, incredible drivers in their own right.

Patrick Long gives me hope and a renewed sense of vigor. He reminds me of a young Yannick Dalmas having Le Mans win in 1992, '94 and '95. I hope his continued efforts will rack up the wins and place him in a category with the likes of Al Holbert and Derek Bell and Hans Stuck which had GT1 wins overall in 1986 and then defended it in '87.

The spirit of a man and his need to fulfill the desire in his heart for a real sports car is echoed in the hearts of drivers like Long and Bergmeister. Their courage and determination along with the countless staff and Porsche people world-wide make me proud to be a German American.

I pick the GT2 class to write about because these cars are more like the ones we drive everyday. They resemble the 996's the GT3's and all the versions of the venerable 911 that some of us get to drive to work everyday. It's an honor for me to think on how great it is for me to be driving a car that became the savior of Porsche AG at one time. It was the multitudes of 924s and 944s which kept Porsche alive in the '80s. Recession hit then too and my car, the blue '89 944

turbo with a sticker price of nearly \$50,000 was hard to sell, but somebody bought it. The Boxster of 1997 was a huge commercial hit. Once again, Porsche had a savior and look at where the little manufacturer from Stuttgart is today.

To conclude, I'd like to thank the Porsche family which means all who sell, service, make and preserve Porsche for their commitment to excellence. For without their efforts, Porsche could never be the most winning manufacturer in the world.

Besides our love for cars we have a collection of toys and cookie jars. We love to travel, make stain glass and attend our Grandchildren events.



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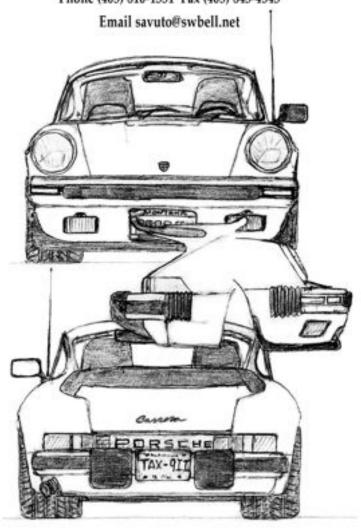




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PCA War Bonnet Board Meeting, May


