January 19th was a cold and windy day but nonetheless exciting. After we had passed the Cadillac Ranch and The Blue Hole (awesome little swim spot, cold, clear and deep) we arrived and began checking out this yellow '73 914. I had already negotiated the deal which included front suspension from an '86 911 and a full fiberglass flare kit, complete with rocker panels and bumpers. The old girl had seen better days but that's the way I like to buy 'em!



Bringing her home was uneventful unlike when I drove my Cayman home. We barely survived a deluge in Amarillo. The rain came with such a fierceness that we pulled off the highway, Laura in her Cayman and me in mine, but within minutes, every road had become a river and these cars aren't exactly seaworthy.

Vince couldn't wait to help me tear this thing apart. The giddiness he couldn't hide probably had him higher than a double shot Red Bull slushie. He was able to take her around the block and home for a few days but after that, we began. The first thing we had to do was take inventory of all the extras I had scored. The 5 lug conversion parts and all that fiberglass took up the entire bed of my truck. After we sorted through

dry fitments, I began to operate by cutting away the steel fenders. I've had to do just a tiny bit of rust repair because Porsche custom installed rust with every 914 ever made. The galvanized bodies of the 944s were a direct result of Porsche's changing ways of manufacturing in the 1970's. I am now riveting panels and beginning the installation process. The real fun is just beginning.



ur first autocross of 2019 was held on Sunday, March 10th

with a respectful turnout. At that event we were hoping to use our new timing equipment for the first time. But as events sometime happens, we were not able to use the new equipment due to the manufacturer not including one of the purchased cables. It was a special nonstandard cable that was not a standard configuration. Because of the missing cable, the first event was timed by using the trusted fallback position of using a stopwatch. This worked and our event was still a success.

During an event in October 2018 we had the finish line timer damaged beyond repair. We found out from the manufacturer that our equipment was 12 years old and they considered it obsolete and no longer supported it with repair parts. In fact, they had revised it with 2 generations of upgrades. The War Bonnet club made the investment in purchasing the currently available generation of new equipment. We purchased a new operator console to display the timing results for the operator and participants to review and use. We also got both the starting line equipment and the finish line equipment which both consist of a source beam and a receiver detector.

Our purchase also included the replacement of the existing batteries with new batteries. There are 4 batteries total with 2 being sealed lead acid and 3 being rechargeable. Each station has several non-interchangeable specialty cables. The timing display is the only retained piece of equipment from our old setup. To further support our autocross events execution, we purchase 5 new multichannel rechargeable radios for use by the cornermen and support personnel. All this equipment has been in use after our March 10th event and was last used during the May 5th event.

We are using the Edmond Fire Training Facility lot to have our autocross events. The Training Facility is in good shape and is large enough that we can have a variety of layouts each month to make each autocross a fun, safe, exciting and educational event. I am always glad to have the regulars come out and to help. Not only with being there but, these people are showing the newer guys a good time and demonstrating the proper way to drive and how our event

should be run and organized. I would now like to thank all the War Bonnet members, and the non-members like Katelyn Hollas that attends the operations console, that come out and help me run each event. Further, I would like to thank them for supporting the event along with participating in it.

We have past the early part of our season and still have the rest of the year to look forward to. We need more attendance at 'our' autocross events. I cannot emphasize enough that this is the War Bonnet autocross but we have opened it up for responsible and enthusiastic sports car drivers to attend. We can take up to twenty-five drivers at every event.

Having new drivers come out to the facility shows their interest to improve their driving skills and abilities; along with that, they benefit from meeting new and interesting people. I am always happy to see and interact with the new drivers that come to our events. I feel that it is always in my best interest to help the new faces to be comfortable

around both the new and old people. I want for them not to be nervous out on the track but alert and learning. Some of them are doing something new and different that at first may seem intimidating and scary. I feel that it is in the club's best interest to put a good and reliable instructor with them to make sure that they don't over extend on their first runs. On their first time on the track they need to gradually build their learning experience and they will learn a lot about improving their skills and abilities. Please help me and the War Bonnet members by letting people know that they can have a fun and a safe time at the Edmond Fire Training Facility. Hope to see you at our next event.


