President's Podium

consider myself a technology junkie in many areas but in others I'm a little slow to adopt. One of these items has been the DVR. Some of you are no doubt surprised that I would not already be completely addicted to its use. I have wondered what tv show I could possibly want to record for later viewing if I missed it the first time. I have found it - Top Gear on BBC. The combination of excellent automotive variety and quaint British humor have me hooked.

One of the questions frequently visited in various themes on the show is the technology of driver aids. Some of these have existed for years such as anti-lock brakes. Generally speaking, these technologies have made the average driver safer. In a panic stop typical drivers with ABS stop in shorter distances than those without. It is probably hard to buy a car without ABS at this point in time. However, the skilled driver can stop a car in a slightly shorter distance without invoking ABS. This carries over to other driver aids such as traction control. My own experience with my C4S is case in point. While I was learning the car at the first few autocross events, I left the PSM (Porsche Stability Management) turned

on. As I gained confidence in the car, I realized situations on the course where it was slowing me down. The next event I turned it off and promptly journeyed through the grass on the second lap. That behind me, I am learning to use the freedom with PSM off to become a better driver. I flash back to the high school hot rod days where if you weren't smooth with a timely countersteer and throttle adjustment, you had a body shop bill as a result.

My point with all of this is to strike a balance between retaining driving skill and allowing your car to do all of the work. I typically leave PSM on around town because I don't always want to concentrate on the conditions. But on DE events or autocross, I want to become proficient at driving a car near the limits without much assistance. If you haven't yet, I suggest you test my theory at a future autocross. You will find more detail about these events in Matt's article. As in prior years the 2012 calendar is well stocked with club events. Check it out and I look forward to seeing you during the year.




