

egulations. It is a word that both pleases and frustrates. The automotive industry plenty; some are significant safety advances, some are simply invasions of our driving freedom. Case in point: one of the fallout items from the Toyota "unintended acceleration" problem recently is a proposed law that "will require all manufacturers to equip cars sold in North America with a smart pedal, or brake override system". Such a system would cut engine power if the gas and brake pedals are applied at the same time. The activation of this system would cause a loss of engine power if the accelerator and brake pedal activation overlapped by some amount - instantaneously in some systems or a half second in others. As an occasional left foot braker, I am not in favor of this system. This is especially true on the track, where a squeeze the brake pedal approaching a accomplished without moving the right foot. I already deal with this in my AMG (automatic) and it has about a half second tolerance for applying both pedals. I would agree with extending this to two seconds or so. I think the runaway car safety concerns could still be addressed with a long enough delay

to allow a little braking overlap. The the "unintended research on acceleration" problem appears to be concluding that a majority of the incidents can be blamed on driver error - not actually moving the right foot to the brake pedal before slamming it down again. I discussed this problem with my 17 year old daughter when it was on the news every night. I made sure she knows to shift to neutral if the acceleration problem occurs. It is better to potentially blow an engine than the alternative.

Fall is here. As many of you are, I am looking forward to football and the option of enjoying some driving in cooler air. While the ability to enjoy a convertible may be nearly gone in a few months, I intend on making the best of it now. Check the club calendar for the planned driving events coming soon.

Ballots will be sent for board members for 2011. Included in this will be menu selections for the Christmas Party. This is always a nice event. I hope to see you there.



The meeting was adjourned and the usual camaraderie was present. This included stealing a look at Brian's 914 project while he wasn't there.








