


President's Podium

Two of the changing components are the sound system and the transmission.

I like some good tunes while I am running solo in a rental in a different city. I used to pack some CD's to entertain myself, not knowing the local stations well. However, I have left more than a few in the player when I returned the car. Now I just pack an auxiliary cable and play the library from my phone. Some of the complete systems, such as Ford's SYNC, allow you all of the phone, hands free, and Bluetooth options ready to go. The latest commercials from Mercedes and others promise internet apps from the "infotainment" system, including social media.

Once I have proper music playing in the rental and I can be on my way, the transmission comes into play. Most new model cars appear to come with a version of the "shiftable" automatic transmission. My latest rental was a



We try and take care of it so that we are not back in flat parking lots and limited to using just two gears in the

transmission. With the help of many club members and some non-members that help me setup the track and bouncing ideas off of each other, we are able to have a safe and fun track that lets you open it up but also teaches you how to control your car both at high speeds and low tricky back and forth maneuvers. I have found that setting up the track the night before makes it possible for me to ask some people to come out and help. We can run the track in a safe manner to make sure that it has enough run off area and that it does not have to many tight turns that could cause you to make some kind of a mistake or break something. We all know how expensive Porsche parts are and I will do my best to set up a safe and fun track.

Like I said, it has been a busy year. Our Bricktown Car Show is coming up in October. I can't wait to see how many cars will show up and all of the different makes from Europe. Treasurer's Tid-Bits

have started many of these articles with: "The treasury continues in sound shape." That continues to be a factual statement. I was trying to figure out what to write about for this issue and I decided to just talk about some of the actual numbers.

Our big charity car show is coming up and likely has come and gone by the time you read this. Last year the car show brought in \$1,269 but the costs were \$651 so we cleared \$618 profit. The autocross brought in the majority of the income for the club. In the last 12 months the autocross brought in \$6375 in entry fees but we spent \$3106 in equipment repair and new pylons, batteries and radios. That still makes a nice profit of \$3,269 for the autocross.

Each year the club pays for part of the cost of the Christmas party meals. For the 2011 Christmas party, the club spent \$530. This year, like the last few years, we paid for the rally & new member appreciation dinner. We spent \$601.76 just for the meal and just over \$100 for the rally prizes.

The War Whoop expenses are a little over \$2,000 for the printing & postage costs. The advertising covers a little under half of that. Another expense has been the board meeting expenses. For each board meeting the club pays for a meal for the attendees, usually pizza. Louis Lackey and Brian Miller

attended the 2012 presidents meeting. The club paid for the expenses for that which was a little over \$800.

Our biggest single expense for the last several years has been charitable donations. Since 2005 we have given \$18,500 to Sunbeam Family services and \$1250 to the Salvation Army.

For many years the club did not make a charitable donation and the treasury just built up. We finally started putting the cash into a CD. We still have a \$25,000 CD as a cushion or as an emergency fund.

The bottom line is right now we have over \$5,000 in the checking account. Added to the CD we have over \$30,000 of hard-earned club assets. There have been endless hours of volunteer work by the many members of War Bonnet Region. Your board of directors have worked hard to spend the club's money in sensible ways. The total salary of all the officers and chairmen totals zero. It is 100% volunteer effort. If you have any questions or comments feel free to come to the next board meeting. The board would love to have your input, or your help. Check the calendar for the location and date of the next board meeting.


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






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
