Coffee and Cars


Coffee and Cars has been a prominent part of the car culture in OKC for years. The OKC version of the largely spontaneous, first Saturday of the month, no registration show up and enjoy event originated on west Memorial near May avenue. The first one I attended was about 15 years ago. A little organization was added and the event moved to North Park Mall at 122nd & N. May. The shopping center was largly vacant when the event

They have sold or given away 20.000 Cars & Coffee OKC tee shirts since the start. Some car clubs will meet off site and come over early in mass to park together. Porsche is always well represented from 100 point 356 restorations to special edition 911 models to the semi exotic GT RS models as well as us regular Porsche folks. It's a good chance to compare notes, parts suppliers and detailing tricks.




Enjoy your cars, common interest with the other owners and have a good time every chance you get. If you have an idea for a club event send me an e-mail. We will take a look.

The lack of autocross was discussed. We spoke about the insurance protection from national. They continue to not send the requested documents and our only clear



e now have a total of 369 total members for our region. This is an decrease of about five members from the last issue.


