





Faux Joe's Drive Brings Surprises

We followed I-44 to I-35 and then South to the 36th Street exit so that we could go by the County Sheriff's Training Center where the club's autocrosses are held. We picked up the Spencer-Jones and then Hog Back Roads. This took us on a nice route down a road that could be very exciting if you saw it on a TV commercial. The bottom of the screen would naturally say "Professional Driver on a Closed Course."

I guess this is how a Porschephile spends his time, planning, wishing, dreaming and doing. Don't even try to persuade me from my passion. Porsche is already part of my soul.







Our Porsche/European Car Show will be this September 25th at the Sonic Corporate headquarters parking lot on Reno in Bricktown. Entry fee will again






